School share of central office spending refers to School system-level expenses, or dollars spent for the benefit of all students in a school system. These include items such as transportation, central office operations, technology operations, maintenance, and property insurance. State/Local funds refer to dollars spent from state and local funding sources, which includes taxes, state school finance formula funds, and other state grants. Federal funds refer to dollars spent from federal funding sources, such as Title programs, special education programs, Medicaid or rehabilitation programs, and other federal grants.
