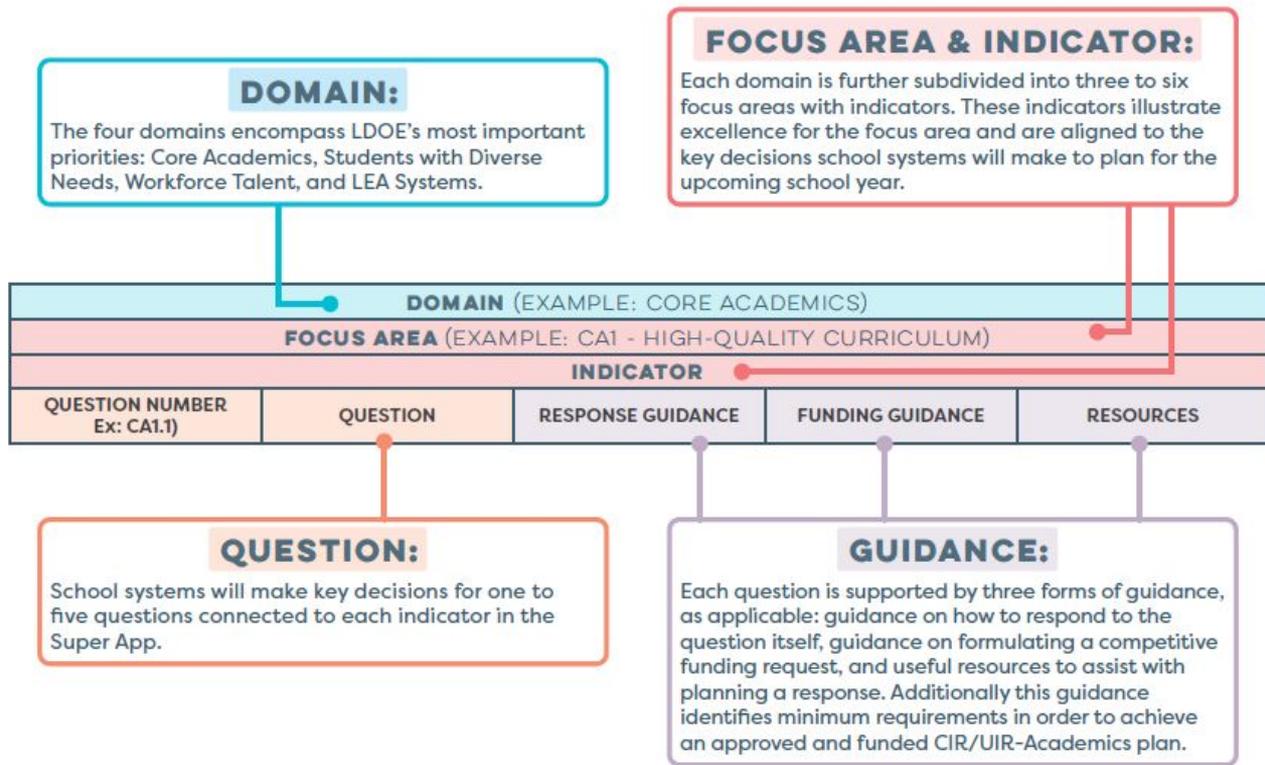


# Objectives

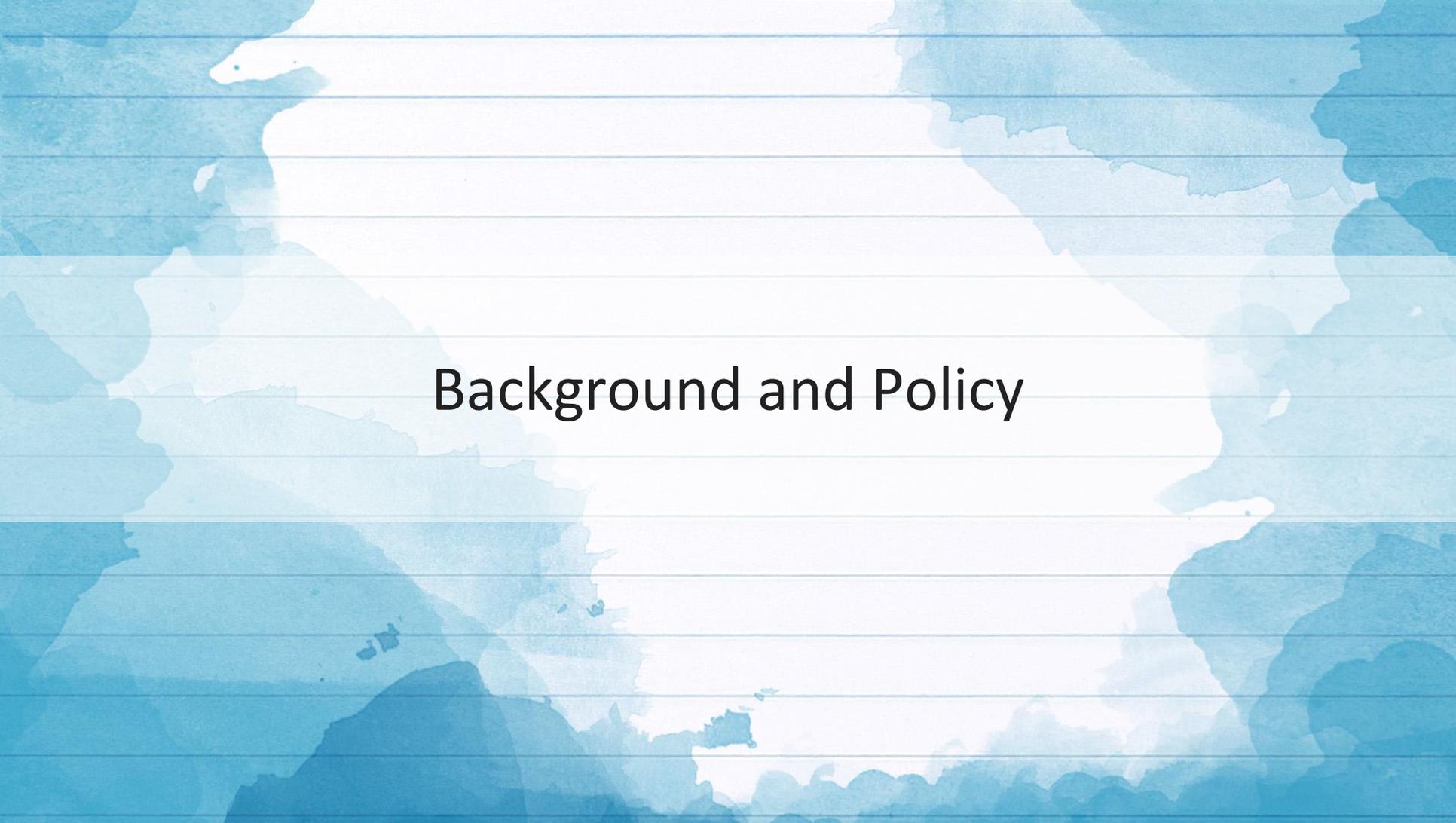

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# Background and Policy

# Content Leaders and Mentors

## Content Leaders

Provide content- and curriculum-specific professional development to teachers in their school and school system using turnkey session materials.

- Lead professional learning communities in schools
- Lead sessions at school and school system professional development days



## Mentor Teachers

- Host and co-teach with an undergraduate resident for the full school year.
- Mentor post-baccalaureate residents who are teaching while earning their initial license or mentor experienced teachers in need of support.
  - Provide one-on-one coaching
  - Lead frequent observation/feedback cycles
  - Review instructional materials and student work



# Content Leaders and Mentors

## Content Leaders

Since the 2017-2018 academic year, the State has provided ELA and Math Content Leader training to a cadre of Louisiana educators. For the 2020-2021 year, LDOE expanded the Content Leader program to offer training for Science teachers.

In the 2021-2022 academic year, LDOE plans to launch Content Leader for K-2 Literacy.



## Mentor Teachers

Since the 2017-2018 academic year, the State has provided Mentor training to a cadre of Louisiana educators. While the four training pathways — Elementary, ELA, Math, and Universal — remain the same, educators can access Mentor training from 29 approved providers in every corner of the State.

In August 2021, LDOE worked with key stakeholders to pare down the number of elementary Mentor assessments from six to four.



# Policy Background

Over the past five years, the Louisiana Legislature, the Board of Elementary and Secondary Education (BESE), and the Louisiana Department of Education (LDOE) have revised expectations and supports for students and teachers.

- In October 2016, BESE, with support from the Board of Regents (BoR), adopted regulations to expand yearlong residencies and competency-based curricula statewide by July 2018.
- In 2016, Louisiana adopted new standards and aligned assessments for students, prompting school systems statewide to transition to using a high-quality curriculum aligned to the state standards.
- In October 2018, BESE adopted regulations that established Mentor Teacher and Content Leader credentials and provided for Mentor and Content Leader training, experience, and credentialing to contribute to school leader licensure.

# Policy Background

Beginning in **September 2020**, every teacher who serves as the Mentor of an undergraduate or post-baccalaureate candidate must hold the Mentor Ancillary Certificate or the Provisional Mentor Ancillary Certificate.

**Mentor Teacher ancillary certificates are issued** to individuals who have successfully completed a state-approved Mentor Teacher training program, including state-led training, and have a passing score on the Louisiana Mentor Teacher Assessment Series.

A one-year **provisional certificate** may be issued to any individual who has completed training or is currently enrolled in Mentor training. The provisional certificate is good for one year and is non-renewable.

*\*Teachers who hold the **Supervision of Student Teaching** credential may serve as a mentor until August 31, 2023.*

# Mentor Teacher Training

Mentor Teachers will have the knowledge, skills, and resources to provide effective, ongoing one-on-one support to new and current teachers in their schools.

To accomplish this, Mentor Teachers receive high-quality, content-rich, and curriculum-specific trainings which teaches them how to:

- Establish a strong relationship and use a coaching cycle to support teachers' growth.
- Prioritize the needs of residents, new, and/or developing teachers based on [teacher preparation competencies](#).
- Build deep knowledge of content and content pedagogy in their subject(s).
- Gain the knowledge and skills they need to effectively help others use high-quality instructional materials.



# Content Leader Training

Content Leaders will have the knowledge, skills, and concrete resources to provide high-quality professional development to new and current teachers in their school system.

To accomplish this, Content Leaders will receive:

- High-quality, content-rich, and curriculum-specific trainings.
  - Deep knowledge of ELA, math, and science content and content pedagogy;
  - The knowledge and skills they need to effectively use and help others use the ELA Guidebooks 2.0, Eureka Mathematics curriculum, Science OpenSciEd curriculum\*; and
  - Best practices for facilitating high-quality learning experiences for fellow educators.
- Access to and training on six, turn-key ELA (grades 3-10), math (grades K-9), and science (grades K-8) [content modules](#) to use to train fellow educators (36 hours total).

*\*In addition to ELA, Math, and Science, K-2 Literacy Content Leader training will be added in summer of 2021.*

# Accessing Mentor and Content Leader Training

In order to access Mentor and Content Leader training, school systems should take the following steps:

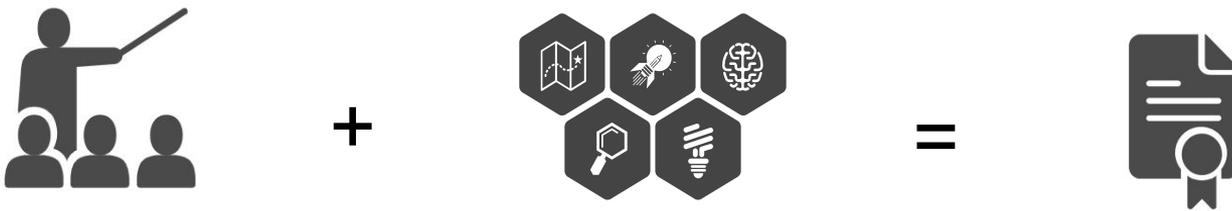
1. Identify the number of Mentors and Content Leaders your school system anticipates needing to train based on numbers of CIR and UIR-A schools, undergraduate residents, post-baccalaureate candidates.
2. Identify the current number of trained Mentors and Content Leaders taking into consideration those who may have moved into different roles.
3. Identify an [approved training provider](#) and contact the approved trainer to negotiate a contract.
4. Ensure that access to the assessment series is included, or contract with the assessment vendor.
5. Develop structures to support participants through the training and distinction process.

# Assessment Series

# Ancillary Certification

Mentor Teachers and Content Leaders who attend all of the trainings **and** successfully complete the assessment series indicating that they have the knowledge and skills to support other teachers will be eligible for an ancillary certificate from the Louisiana Department of Education.

**School sites with the CIR label must have a Mentor who holds the ancillary or provisional certificate.** This certification designates that teachers have successfully completed a state-approved training and assessment, and have the skills and knowledge needed to effectively serve in a Mentor Teacher or Content Leader role.



# Assessment Series

The Content Leader and Mentor Teacher trainings were designed keeping in mind the skills and knowledge Mentor Teachers and Content Leaders would need to effectively serve in these roles.

The Assessment Series was designed to ensure that teacher leaders serving in these roles had the skills and knowledge they needed to do so effectively.

Completion of the assessment series indicates that a participant was not simply a passive participant in the training experience, but that they are able to demonstrate the skills they were taught.

# Assessment Overview

- Unlike traditional paper and pencil assessments, these assessments are based on and draw from a teacher's work as a Mentor Teacher or Content Leader.
- The assessments are based on artifacts from the teacher's work with students, mentees, and other teachers to demonstrate sufficient knowledge and skill to successfully serve in these roles.
- Teachers submit artifacts through a secure online system managed by Bloomboard.
- Ideally, teachers create many of the artifacts needed to earn distinction through the course of the trainings and as they serve in the role.

# Structure of All Assessments

## Adult Group Learning Facilitation

Facilitating adult group learning requires a strong grasp of content, purposeful planning, and methods to assess the impact of that learning. Content Leaders will incorporate effective learning models, structures, and processes into their plan and delivery of an adult group learning session. When adult learners are engaged in experiential learning that links directly to their professional learning needs, instructional practices improve and have a direct impact on student achievement.

- **ANALYZE** an upcoming adult group learning session
- **DEVELOP** an annotated Facilitation Guide that will guide the successful facilitation of the session
- **IMPLEMENT** your adult group learning session
- **EVALUATE** the success with reflections

# Support on the Distinction Process

School systems that have successfully supported Mentors and Content Leaders in completing the assessment series have done the following:

1. Identify an owner of the initiative at the system level.
2. Ensure Mentors and Content Leaders are connected to others who are also completing the assessment series either informally or through structured monthly collaboration.
3. Identify an assessment coach who can review and provide support on artifacts prior to submission.
4. Ensure Mentors have a mentee to support, as this is required to complete the assessment series.
5. Ensure Content Leaders have dedicated time to redeliver Content Modules, as this is required to complete the assessment series.

# Funding Recap
