

U.S. Senate Youth Program

 Program in Washington D.C. during the week of March 2-9, 2024. Upon completion of all on-site
 events, these two delegates will each receive a \$10,000 education scholarship.
- Juniors or seniors may qualify to apply through leadership positions they hold during the 2023-2024 school year per the USSYP official criteria for the current academic school year.
- Students nominated by their principals must submit an application and a portfolio of required USSYP official criteria information to the Louisiana Department of Education by **October 3.**

Financial Aid Planning

All 2024 graduating seniors must complete one of the following:

- The <u>2024-2025 FAFSA</u> application (if you want to apply for the federal Pell grant, federal student loans, the Louisiana GO Grant, and TOPS)
- A <u>TOPS application</u> on the LOSFA website (if you want TOPS only)

or

A waiver

The U.S. Department of Education is revamping the FAFSA application. The application will open in December 2023 instead of October 2023 (this year only).

Registered Apprenticeship Funding 2023-2024

- Funding based on the number of students enrolled in either fall or spring semester in an eligible registered apprenticeship course
- \$3,500 per student school system identified as rural by the United States Census Bureau
- \$2,500 per student school system identified as non-rural

Funding can be utilized to support all of the costs associated with delivery of the apprenticeship services to the students.

Diploma Requirement Reminder

TOPS University Diploma

- Foreign Language additions
 - Computer Science as a Foreign Language Guidance
 - For Fall grade 9 entry 2023-2024 graduating in 2026-2027 and thereafter

Jump Start TOPS Tech (Career Diploma) Requirements

- Geometry
 - For Fall grade 9 entry 2023-2024 and thereafter, Geometry is required. For grade 9 entry prior to 2023-2024, students must take three additional Math courses of which Geometry is an option.

2023 Legislative Updates

HB 103 (Act 267) - Adds financial Literacy as a required high school course.

At this time, BESE has not approved policy regarding Financial Literacy (Act 267). Once BESE approves the policy and it exits notice of intent, LDOE will release guidance.

The Academic Content team will create and release course guidance for the high school Financial Literacy Course. The Academic Content team processes submissions for a Personal Financial Literacy Instruction Clearinghouse pursuant to Louisiana state law (R.S. 17:270), in order to support local school systems with implementation.



Policy Reminder

Per Bulletin 741 §2319.C.2

i. Jump Start 1.0 course sequences will be available for incoming freshmen through 2020-2021; and

ii. Jump Start 2.0 course sequences will be available for incoming freshmen beginning in 2020-2021

Policy references grade 9 entry and STS is programmed based on grade 9 entry.

Policy Reminder

Bulletin 741 §901.F: Beginning with the 2020-2021 school year, the school counselor must:

- 1. Finalize the individual graduation plan for each graduating senior;
- Upload all academic records into the state student transcript system (STS);
- 3. Post the student's graduation date prior to the awarding of a diploma.

Career Development Fund End of Year Reporting

- The <u>2022-2023 Career Development Fund (CDF) End of Year Expenditure Report</u> is available for school systems to complete. The deadline to report on 2022-2023 CDF expenditures is **August 31**. Schools systems should reference the <u>2022-2023 Guidelines for Use of CDF Allocation</u> when completing the form.
- CDF funds support increased student access to high-value Career and Technical Education courses and training. CDF funds are 6% of the MFP State and Local Base Cost Per Pupil (\$241) provided for each qualifying student course enrollment in grades 9 through 12.

To earn the recognition, schools shall engage in the following activities:

- Designate a staff member to serve as a military liaison and engage in the following:
- Serve as the primary point of contact for military connected students and families
- Work to identify special considerations needed by military-connected students and families
- Develop training to inform teachers and other school personnel of those special considerations
- Create a dedicated page on its website featuring resources for military-connected students and families
- Create a student-led transition program to provide peer support for military-connected students
