

- Girls Conditioning Foundational Skills After School Program (2017-2019)
 - After School program for high school girls at an urban school
 - Whole child approach social/emotional development, physical fitness, academic enrichment, identity development, mental health, cognitive development
 - Used Journey of Hope for Adolescents Curriculum (Save the Children, USA)
 - Monday through Thursday from 2:30 p.m. to 4:30 p.m.
 - Evening Snack was included
 - Transportation was not provided

Flashback: After School Program









What were the benefits of this program?

- School attendance for all participants either remained the same or improved.
- Family engagement increased
- Suspensions decreased
- Academics for participants improved
- Community partnerships were developed/strengthened



What Does the Research Say?

- Increased school attendance
- Dropout rates decrease
- Well-being is improved
- Juvenile crime can be reduced



Current Barriers

- Programs can be expensive
 - For systems
 - For families
- Lack of programs
 - Rural communities
- Transportation to and from programs
 - No way home after school
 - Rides bus so before school options are not options



Solutions

- Develop your own program
- Enlist community partners and agencies
- Funding is abundant for these programs; know where to look
- Connect with community partners to address transportation needs
