History of School Nursing





History of School Nursing

The development of the school nursing concept came to be when New York City tried to think of ways to decrease their problems with absenteeism in their schools.

The Experiment

In 1897, the city of New York hired 150 doctors to try and help decrease the number of absences of students and decrease the spread of communicable diseases.







The First School Nurse

In 1902, the New York School District gave Lina Rogers, a lone nurse, a one month trial to work in 4 schools with a student population of almost 9,000. The goal was to reduce the absenteeism and communicable disease problems that continued to plague their school district.



The Role of the School RN


Today the school nursing model is much the same as it was in the early 1900s and still provides:

- Direct care
- Case Management
- Advocating for students and families
- Education for parents/guardians/teachers/staff

Chronic Absenteeism & Truancy


Chronic Absenteeism-

incorporates all absences: excused, unexcused and suspensions. The focus is on the academic consequences of this lost instructional time and on preventing absences before students miss so much school that they fall behind.

Truancy -a term that generally refers to unexcused absences. In the past, federal law required states to track truancy but left it to states to come up with the definition.

Truancy is defined as students who have 5 tardies or 5 unexcused absences in a semester.

Contributing Factors



Challenges Facing Today's Students

- Asthma
- Seizure disorders
- Food Allergies
- Obesity
- Inadequate dental health



Managing Chronic Health Conditions

The school RN is tasked with the management of students with chronic health conditions and the development of the Individual Health Plan (IHP).



Exclusion Criteria of the Ill Child



Managing the Ill Child

Students who present in the nursing office with a complaint of illness are screened. If the student is determined to have a potential contagious illness, the student is excluded from school.





When to Exclude

- Illness prevents participation
- Fever
- Care needs are greater than staff can provide
- Suspected communicable disease
- Vomiting two or more times
- Diarrhea that is not contained
- Mouth sores that cause excessive drooling



Conclusion

School RNs, through management of chronic conditions, medication administration, exclusion of the ill child, and general health screenings, help to keep students in school where they are able to learn and become productive members of society. The role of the school RN helps to eliminate the need for most students to be sent home thus decreasing chronic absenteeism.
