

What is Project AWARE?

- LA AWARE 2
 - **Defining** trauma and how it impacts student behavior and well-being.
 - **Recognizing** symptoms of trauma and how to respond through a trauma-informed lens.
 - **Applying** trauma-informed principles and practices to school climate and culture.
 - **Goal -** regulate and promote safety, connectedness & belonging, and emotional regulation & coping. Training School Staff to recognize and respond.
 - School Selection- Current AWARE 2 Schools are CES, BELA, MHS & BHS. Additional school can be added for year 3. (5 year grant) Avoyelles Parish was chosen to participate in the grant based on need. The population of Avoyelles is at a greater risk and more likely to be exposed to traumatic events. (Poverty, Community Violence and Crime, UIR/UIN Schools, etc.)

What is Trauma?

Trauma is defined as an event, series of events or set of circumstances that is experienced by an individual as physically or emotionally harmful or life threatening and that has lasting adverse effects on the individual's functioning and mental, physical, social or emotional well-being.

LA AWARE Grant Overview - How We Do This

Universal Screener & Referrals-all students at your school will need to complete an initial Universal Screener that can identify mental health concerns. Students identified from the screener as "at risk" will receive ongoing interventions (Tier 1 & Tier 2). In-house therapy (Tier 3) can be provided if necessary. Only "at risk" students will do SDQ surveys.

- Quiet Rooms-each school is equipped with the QR to provide Tiered Services. The grant will provide all the materials for this space. It needs to be inviting and calming.
- Data Collection-CPM has admin access to all electronic programs for reporting to the LDOE. Data Hub-quarterly/annual grant reporting.
- Community-funds for advertising mental health events held in the district.

Where Do You Start?

Be aware of what you do, why you do it, how it feels, and what the outcomes are. Although self-care means different things to different people, here's a basic checklist that can be followed by all of us:

- Self-care needs to be something you actively plan, rather than something that just happens. It is an active
 choice and you must treat it as such. Add certain activities to your calendar, announce your plans to others in
 order to increase your commitment, and actively look for opportunities to practice self-care.
- Stick to the basics. Over time you will find your own rhythm and routine. You will be able to implement more
 and identify more forms of self-care that work for you.
- Create a "no" list, with things you know you don't like or you no longer want to do. Examples might include not
 checking emails at night, not attending gatherings you don't like, or not answering your phone during lunch/dinner.
- Eat a nutritious, healthy diet.
- Get enough sleep. Adults usually need seven to eight hours of sleep each night.
- Exercise. Exercise is as good for our emotional health as it is for our physical health. It increases serotonin levels, leading to improved mood and energy. In line with the self-care conditions, what's important is that you choose a form of exercise that you like!
- Follow up with medical care. It is not unusual to put off checkups or visits to the doctor.
- Use relaxation exercises and/or practice meditation. You can do these exercises at any time of the day.
- Spend enough time with your loved ones.
- Do at least one relaxing activity every day, whether it's taking a walk or spending 30 minutes unwinding in a way that promotes well-being.
