

History of School Nursing

The development of the school nursing concept came to be when New York City tried to think of ways to decrease their problems with absenteeism in their schools.





The Experiment

In 1897, the city of New York hired 150 doctors to try and help decrease the number of absences of students and decrease the spread of communicable diseases.



The First School Nurse

In 1902, the New York School District gave Lina Rogers, a lone nurse, a one month trial to work in 4 schools with a student population of almost 9,000. The goal was to reduce the absenteeism and communicable disease problems that continued to plague their school district.





Then and Now

Valuable Lessons Learned

As in the early 1900's, the benefits of having a school nurse continue to show their worth by:

- Improving student health
- Improving student attendance
- Helping society save money





School Nursing Today

School Nursing Defined

School nursing is a form of healthcare that is seen within the school setting and is defined as:

"A specialized practice of professional nursing that advances the well-being, academic success, and lifelong achievement of students." NASN





Roles of a School Nurse

School nurse's today manage their students healthcare needs through:

- Providing direct care
- Providing leadership for health services
- Providing screening and referral for health conditions
- Promoting a healthy school environment
- Promoting health
- Providing a leadership role for health policies and programs
- Serving as a liaison between families, school personnel, health care providers, and the community



Providing Direct Care

The school nurse provides direct care for injuries, acute illnesses and long term management of special health care needs.





Provides Leadership for Health Services

The school nurse is the healthcare leader in the school setting who develops a plan of care to ensure the student's health needs are met.





Provides Screening and Referral for Health Services

Screening referrals such as vision and hearing are conducted by school nurses at the beginning of every school year.



Promotes a Healthy School Environment

The school nurse promotes a health school environment through assessment of immunization records, excluding the ill child, and reporting communicable diseases.

Promotes Health

The school nurse also promotes health through health education of students, teachers, staff, parents, and community members. The school nurse also promotes health by participation in their local school health advisory councils (SHAC).





Provides Leadership Role for Health Policies and Programs

The school nurse serves as the health care expert in schools and can help in development and evaluation of health policies.





Serves as a Liaison

The school nurse serves as a liaison between school personnel, parents, students, healthcare providers, and community.

Conclusion

Lina Rogers helped in developing the role of school nursing that is still used today. Through health assessments, triage, exclusion of the ill child, and referrals, the school nurse design helps to promote a safe and healthy environment for all students in our schools.


