
- Proactive teacher planning for individualized student supports

- 4. Behavior management plan





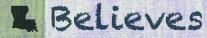







Implementation Check Point

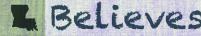



Literacy Screener Policy

<u>Bulletin 741</u> - Louisiana Handbook for School Administrators - Addresses requirements outlined in R.S. <u>17:24.9</u> which include: administering the literacy screener three times per school year to each student in kindergarten through third grade (within the first thirty days, in December, and in April).



Indicators for K-3


- Letter-Naming Fluency: A measure of student's ability to rapidly name letters.
- Phonemic Segmentation Fluency: a measure of how rapidly students can identify the sounds heard in words.
- Nonsense Word Fluency: A
 measure of students' ability to apply
 learned code-knowledge by
 decoding words with no meaning.






Indicators for K-3

- Word Reading Fluency: a measure of students' automaticity in applying code-knowledge by reading high frequency words with meaning.
- Oral Reading Fluency: A measure of students' reading fluency. Students read passages and their reading rate and accuracy are compared to national, grade-level norms.
- MAZE: a measure of students' reading comprehension. Students read a short passage and fill in missing words by identifying words that make the most sense.





How Should an Administrator Use Literacy Screener Data?

- Identify school-wide/grade-level areas that might need additional professional learning
- Provide *literacy coaches* with clear, targeted support for teachers aligned to data.
- Identify subgroups that are struggling early-on; targeted support in reading foundations can be an important preventative measure.
- Set short-term and long-term <u>literacy goals</u> at the school, teacher, adn student level.




Pyramid of Interventions

Tier I: All students - Core classroom instruction

Tier II: Targeted small-group instruction


Tier III: Intensive individual instruction






If your pyramid looks like this, intensify the core instruction.

- Evaluate teacher effectiveness of core delivery and provide professional learning in area of need
- Ensure adequate amount of time to provide instruction
- Consider alignment of small group instruction to core instruction
- Use screener data to determine areas of additional practice
- Increase opportunities for students to read, write, listen, and speak across all content areas.
- Involve families in student learning at home








Action Steps

- 1. Ensure all students are assessed with the full battery of the literacy screener.
- 2. Inform families of their child's literacy proficiency.
- 3. Create individual literacy plans for all students below reading proficiency.
- 4. Analyze screener data to set literacy goals and action steps to meet those goals.
