The Louisiana School Safety Initiative (LSSI)
under the Louisiana State Analytical and Fusion Exchange
(LA-SAFE) is based on analysis of security assessments
carried out in schools across the state. LA-SAFE serves as the
clearinghouse for information on school-related threats and
acts of violence.

LA-SAFE also supports public safety and homeland security in an all-crimes/all-hazards environment and to support federal, state, and local agencies by collecting, analyzing, and disseminating information and intelligence data regarding criminal and terrorist activity.





BLUE RIBBON COMMISSION How We Started

2018 - Governor Edwards created the Blue Ribbon School Safety Commission after the Parkland and Sandy Hook schools shooting and appointed Louisiana State Police Colonel along with the DOE Superintendent to serve on the commission.

2018 - State-wide School Threat Evaluations was completed on Louisiana schools by utilizing a 100+ questionnaire.





<u>In 2018</u>, LSP applied and was awarded <u>TWO GRANTS</u>:

COPS School Violence Prevention Program (SVPP):

To improve law enforcement's response to an active threat through technology.

Bureau of Justice Assistance (BJA), STOP School Violence:

To create a single anonymous reporting system statewide.

After an extensive search, LSP found the RAVE Panic Button App and the Crimestoppers Safe Schools Louisiana App are the statewide solutions and response to Louisiana school safety needs.

SB 207 Creates the School Safety Act of 2023

- ACT 334
- Creation of the Center for Safe Schools within GOHSEP by <u>12/1/2023</u>
- Implement a statewide <u>panic emergency notification system</u> as well as an <u>anonymous reporting</u> <u>system</u>, by <u>4/1/24</u>.
- Provides for bleeding control kits to be placed in all schools and training.
- Requires a district threat assessment team be created and provides they have input on the creation and revision of school crisis management and response plans.
- Provides that at least one school safety drill be conducted during high traffic points during the school day.
- Requires in-service crisis management and response training including an active shooter scenario.
- Bill lead by the Louisiana Legislative Youth Advisory Council and Senator Milligan.



What is a Behavioral Threat Assessment and Management (BTAM)?

Behavioral threat assessment and management (often referred to as threat assessment)

A **<u>systematic</u>** approach to violence prevention intended to identify and mitigate threats that are:

- Transient (not serious) or
- Substantive (poses a continuing risk to others)

The primary goal of Behavioral Threat Assessment is to evaluate the difference between <u>making a threat</u> and <u>posing a threat</u> to a school community and then to build a <u>management plan</u> that supports the safety of the entire community.

Three (3) Primary Behavioral Threat Assessment Methodologies

Comprehensive School Threat Assessment Guidelines (CSTAG)

- Created by Dewey G. Cornell, Ph.D.
- Uses a 5-step structured process and decision tree
- Evidence-based and peer-reviewed

******Virginia Model

National Threat Assessment Center (NTAC) – aka Federal Model

- Created by the US Secret Service and the National Threat Assessment Center
- Uses 11 open-ended questions
- Based on empirical research Mixed Methods of research

Salem-Keizer Cascade

- Created by John Van Dreal
- Combination of structured and open-ended questions
- Focuses on collaboration throughout the school community
- · Derived from practice within a school setting

Creating a BTAM Tool

Using best practice (All - Three (3) Primary Behavioral Threat Assessment Methodologies)

• BTAM Process:

Identity, Investigate, Assessment, Manage

BTAM Tool / Questionnaire / Open-Ended Questions:

- Threat Factors, Early Warning Sign Factors, At-Risk Factors, Protective Factors
 (Type, method, target of threat), (Violent behavior, depression, suicide issues, access to weapons), (Discipline history, poor grades, drugs), (Supportive system)

Triage / Assessment:

Using a team approach and based on information gathered using the BTAM

Priority / Level of Concern:

P1 (Critical), P2 (High), P3 (Moderate), P4 (Low), P5 (No Identified Concerns)

Management

Follow-up





Creating a Multidisciplinary BTAM Team

<u>BTAM Team</u> - Should have appropriately trained, and have collective expertise in school administration, mental health, academic instruction, and law enforcement.

The BTAM Team – Must include:

- School Administrator
- Mental Health Professional
- School Resource Officer (SRO)


