Department of Education Transition

- Division of Educator Certification and Credentialing and Division of Educator Development are being combined.
- Preparation, Credentialing, Certification, Development, and Accountability will all be under one umbrella
 - Division of Educator Talent and Workforce Development
- Transition period: January 22 February 2
- Effective February 5, 2024
- Lead by Arthur M. Joffrion, Jr., Ed.D., Deputy Assistant Superintendent



Third Party Entity

All entities contracting educators to serve Louisiana students must be approved by BESE for those evaluations to be used for certification.

The Third Party Entity approval process was approved during the January BESE meeting.

Third Party Entity

A pilot round of applications was accepted and approved at January BESE. The following entities were approved to operate as a Third Party Entity:

- Southeastern Louisiana University
- Louisiana National Guard Education Programs (YCP, etc.)
- Edmentum Instructional Services



New Literacy Exam Option

BESE adopted the Louisiana Elementary Multiple-Subjects exam, which includes the Teaching of Reading exam, as a part of the English Language Arts subtest.

- Allows for an option with the same number of exams as currently required
- Includes grades K-3 (PK-3, 1-5, Special Education areas)
- Passing score increases over time to gradually increase Science of Reading skill mastery for teacher candidates



Add-on Literacy Requirements (General)

For add-on purposes, general reading and literacy hours may be fulfilled with:

- The indicated semester hours
 - Successful completion of the BESE-approved <u>literacy foundations</u> <u>training</u> *may* be accepted for the number of hours approved per program
- Equivalent contact hours or
- Passing the adopted Teaching of Reading <u>exam</u>

LETRS completion certificates must be verified by <u>LouisianaLiteracy@la.gov</u> for add-on credit.

Add-on Literacy Requirements (Grades K-3, **Special Education)**

For add-on in areas authorized to teach grades K-3 and special education areas, educators must meet:

General literacy contact or semester hour equivalent requirements

AND*

Teaching of Reading exam requirements



Bayou Bridges Curriculum Guide



The LDOE has published a new curriculum guide to support teachers and instructional leaders as they implement Bayou Bridges materials. The guide provides in-depth information on the program's guiding principles, design, key components and resources, unit and lesson study tools, along with sample lesson annotations.

Act 260 Numeracy Training Requirements

Act 260 (2023) requires all grade 4-8 public school teachers of mathematics to receive **numeracy skills training** focused on instructing students according to the vertical alignment of math concepts and the blending of concepts, procedures, strategies, problem-solving, and disposition. Initial guidance is now available.


Alternate assessments are reserved for the approximately 1% of students.



Kindergarten Dyslexia Screening

Act 266 requires teachers to screen all kindergarten students for dyslexia during the second half of the year or upon request of a parent/guardian or teacher.

School systems are required to complete Section One of the April Dunn Act Self-Assessment Guide by February 29.

Self-assessment results should be kept on file. The Department will audit self-assessment results.

K-3 Literacy EOY Assessment



K-3 Literacy EOY Assessment Window

The K-3 literacy screening window will open on April 1 and will close on April 30.

- Per state law, there can be no extensions into May.
- The assessment calendar has been updated.



Deadline for IEPs/IAPs/EL Checklists

State policy requires that all IEPs, IAPs, and EL Checklists be final no later than 30 days prior to the opening of the state's testing window.

K-3 Literacy Assessment: IEPs, IAPs, EL Checklists must be final by March 1



K-3 Literacy EOY Assessment

- There will be NO PAPER OPTION for grades K through 2. All administration must be done online. The screener will be a secure form, which means that it cannot be copied, photographed, memorized, or discussed.
- There can be no remote administration option for grades K through 2.
- mCLASS will not accept file uploads.

Any attempt to duplicate, save, or memorize items will be considered a serious test security violation.

K-3 Literacy EOY Testing Schedules

Testing schedules are due to assessment@la.gov by March 18.

- Please be mindful that LEAP 2025 CBT starts April 15.
- Reserve 5-10 days to conduct make-up testing.

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K-3 Literacy EOY Assessment

The Department will provide a new student file to Amplify for preloading students. All requested transfers made during Window 2 will be updated to the data that is now in EdLink for the applicable students. MOY data will transfer with the student.

- All grade level updates and site code updates should now be reflected in EdLink.
- From March 1 to March 16 the mCLASS Admin Portal will be closed. All other activities will remain open.



K-3 Literacy Accountability Codes for Students

For End-of-Year screening, users can apply accountability codes for students who are not screened and for whom an accountability code applies to them. There are no special codes for screening.

- •Codes 01-44 and 97: These codes can only be used for students who are also exited from EdLink with the same exit reason code. At the time that the student data file was pulled from EdLink at the end of February, students with exit codes were excluded from the file.
- •Code 80: This code can only be used with a doctor's letter. Please note that for all testing, there must be a doctor's letter to apply this code that does not use a student's disability as the sole reason for not testing, and the letter must includes all dates of the screening window.
- There is no code 81 for EL students since the data will not enter into accountability for schools until 2025-2026. (Code 81 is always used on a test that is taken.)

Louisiana Statute 17:24.9 mandates districts to report the number of students identified for referral for gifted evaluation for every literacy screening administration for Kindergarten through Grade 3.

The following data sets will be collected for each grade level:

- The number of gifted students scoring in the above-average range on the literacy screener.
- The number of non-gifted students referred for additional screening.
- The number of non-gifted students referred for gifted evaluation.

Louisiana Educator Advancement and Development System (LEADS) Learning Year Options

During the 2024-2025 Evaluation Learning Year, school systems will be given the option to transition to the new LEADS evaluation system or remain in the COMPASS evaluation system. Additional information about each option is available on the 2024-2025 Evaluation Learning Year Options Guidance.

- The 2024-2025 Evaluation Learning Year will include extensive options for training and ongoing support through this summer and the next school year.
- Complete the 2024-2025 Evaluation Learning Year Options Form by March 30.



LEADS Summer Evaluation Training

Systems opting to transition to the LEADS evaluation system should register for summer training. The <u>registration landing page</u> has now been updated and includes a waiting list.

- System level leaders and school leaders will complete a two-day Louisiana Leader Evaluation Training and pass a certification assessment prior to evaluating leaders with the Louisiana Leader Evaluation System.
- System level leaders, school level leaders, and designated observers will complete a three-day Louisiana Educator Evaluation Training and pass a certification assessment prior to observing with the Louisiana Educator Rubric. Note: Those currently certified on the NIET Teaching and Learning Standards Rubric may qualify for a one-day training.

Louisiana Educator Evaluation System

- Louisiana Educator Rubric (LER): A research-based rubric that helps build a common language, and is correlated with student achievement and growth
- Training and Certification: A process that leads to more fair and reliable educator evaluations by certified observers
- **Formal Observations:** Each observation is followed by a post-conference where teachers are supported in reflecting on the lesson
- **Professionalism Domain:** This domain on the Louisiana Rubric allows for the assessment and acknowledgement of teacher growth and reflection, community involvement, and school responsibilities
- **Self-assessment:** A reflection opportunity that leads to greater teacher voice in the evaluation process
- Follow-up coaching and support cycles: High-quality post-observation feedback, with an aligned coaching and support cycle, will enhance teacher growth

Louisiana Leader Evaluation System

- Louisiana Leader Rubric (LLR): A research-based rubric that provides school leaders with a common language for effective leadership practices
- **Training and Certification:** A process that leads to more fair and reliable leader evaluations by certified observers
- **Beginning-of-Year (BOY) Conference:** School leaders receive support with goal-setting, action-planning, and establishing a climate of continuous growth
- Middle-of-Year (MOY) Conference: School leaders are supported in reflection on successes and evidence of progress toward goals, revisions to the action plan, and reflection on indicator ratings
- End-of-Year (EOY) Conference: School leaders are supported in a summative reflection on evidence of goal attainment, strengths and growth areas, and indicator ratings
- Self-assessment: A reflection opportunity that leads to greater leader voice in the evaluation process
- School Principal Survey: Affords teachers the opportunity to give feedback on principal impact (only school principals)

Compass Information System (CIS) Reminders

Please use the CIS 2023-2024 Timeline to monitor data entry into the Compass Information System (CIS). The following tasks should be complete at this time.

- School site rosters should be updated.
- Evaluators should be assigned.
- Teachers and leaders should have at least two <u>Student Learning Targets</u> (SLTs) entered and accepted.
- Observations should be entered as completed.

April Dunn Act Implementation Monitoring

To support the effective implementation of the April Dunn Act, the LDOE created the <u>April Dunn Act Self-Assessment Guide</u> (SAG).

This guide is a comprehensive analysis of the implementation process, including the review of procedures and data to determine valid and systemic conclusions.

When completed with fidelity, the SAG will be helpful in identifying any root causes of performance and implementation issues in your LEA,

April Dunn Act Self-Assessment Guide

Beginning February 2024, self-assessments should be conducted annually.

April Dunn Act Monitoring

For the 2023-2024 school year, school systems are required to complete Section One of the self-assessment by **February 29**. Sections Two and Three are not required but strongly recommended.

Self-assessment results should be kept on file. The Department will audit self-assessment results to ensure they accurately represent best practices in the implementation of the April Dunn Act.

Act 266 (HB 69) Dyslexia Screening Update

Screener Requirements

- LDOE to select and provide to each public school (at no cost) a dyslexia screener with the following requirements:
 - o area under curve of 0.80 or above
 - developed solely for dyslexia
 - evidence-based with proven, published psychometric validity
 - o used to determine if a student is at risk
- To be administered by a teacher in second half of kindergarten or any time requested by a teacher or parent/guardian
- Within 30 days of at risk results the parent is to be notified

 While the LDOE works to complete the Request for Proposals (RFP) procurement process, systems will continue to utilize the screening tool that has been administered in the past.



Grades 3-5 Modified ELA Guidebook Units


ELA Modified Guidebook Guide 3-5 addresses Louisiana Connectors for students with significant cognitive disabilities.

Guidebook text modifications include

an overall summary of the text with shortened story length, enlarged font size, utilization of graphics, bolded vocabulary words in a different font color, and gray background color.

Student materials include

a vocabulary chart, table identifying main characters, and materials to test the learner's knowledge.





Literacy Alternate Assessment Rubric

K-3 students who are determined eligible by the IEP team for alternate assessments using the K-2 Alternate Assessment Participation

Decision-Making Tool or the 3-11 alternate assessment criteria may use the Literacy Alternate Assessment Rubric.

- Kindergarten Literacy Alternate Assessment
- <u>1st-Literacy Alternate Assessment</u>
- 2nd Literacy Alternate Assessment
- 3rd Literacy Alternate Assessment
- Reading Improvement Plan for Students with Significant Cognitive Disabilities

Alternate assessments are reserved for the approximately 1% of students.

Act 522: K-3 Literacy Priorities

- Literacy Screener all K-3 students, 3x per year with parent reporting within 15 days
 - Available reports in DIBELS platform
 - Caretaker Report shares data with explanation of measures
 - Home Connect Report at-home literacy activities
- Individual Reading Improvement Plans for all students below proficiency
- School Literacy Plans posted on website
- Literacy Coach to support teachers



Act 108: Foundational Literacy Training

- Act 108 requires training for K-3 teachers and administrators based on the science of reading.
- School systems must report to the Department on successful training completion.
- Schools and school systems must begin requiring teachers and administrators to complete at least one approved professional development course by the 2023-2024 school year.
- Any teacher or administrator hired after August 1, 2023, must provide proof of successful completion within two years of employment.



Bulletin 1566: 3rd & 4th Grade Summer Learning

Beginning with the 2022-2023 school year, and continuing through the summer following the 2023-2024 school year, any student enrolled in third or fourth grade and scoring below grade-level on the end-of-the-year LDOE-approved literacy assessment shall receive a minimum of 30 hours of explicit literacy instruction inclusive of targeted interventions during the summer or risk retention.

- No tuition or fees can be charged for the attendance of an eligible student, and transportation must be offered.
- The LEA may waive the state policy for students scoring below grade-level for students with an IEP at the discretion of the IEP team.



Act 422: Third Grade Retention

Prohibits promotion to the fourth grade of certain students whose reading deficiencies have not been remediated by the end of the third grade.

- Literacy screening
- Individual reading plan
- Exceptions for good cause
- Required instructional services to retained students



K-3 Literacy Screener

State law mandates that all students in kindergarten through third grade participate in a single statewide literacy screening three times per year. This includes students with IEPs or IAPs, English learners, non-readers and students who qualify for alternate assessment based on the K-2 Alternate Assessment Participation Decision-making Tool for K-2 and the LEAP Connect criteria for Grade 3.

Annual Teacher Exit Survey Released

The annual <u>Teacher Exit Survey</u> highlights the progress of Louisiana's comprehensive recruitment and retention strategy. This past year saw the following improvement:

- For the first time in four years, there was an increase in the total teacher workforce.
- The rate of exiting teachers decreased one percentage point from 14 to 13 percent.
- Top 3 reasons for teachers exiting their current position remain the same: personal reasons, transferring to another Louisiana school system, and retirement.

Mentor Funding

School Systems received Mentor funding in mid-January. System leads also received an email with a list of Mentors eligible for funding on January 12.

If a school system did not receive funding for a Mentor the most likely reason for ineligibility is:

- The Mentor was not coded as 112, teacher.
- The Mentor did not possess the required Mentor certification or Mentor waiver by October 1, 2023.
- The resident they supported did not hold their required certification (PL or resident license) by October 1, 2023.

Pre-K Mentor Funding

Mentors coded as Pre-K teachers are not eligible for MFP Mentor funding. School systems receive funding for these Mentors through an allocation in EGMs, using 8g funding.

If your school system reported an eligible Pre-K Mentor, the system lead should have received an email following the January BESE meeting with details about accessing this funding in EGMs.

2024-2025 Evaluation Learning Year

Key Improvements for Educator and Leader Evaluation include:

- Grounded in evidence-based practices that enhance teaching and leadership practices:
- A more fair and transparent process that includes multiple measures, supports self reflection, and gives teachers a voice;
- **Better feedback** for improvement and resources to support individual growth; and
- Stronger connections between evaluation and professional learning.

Professional Learning Platform

The LDOE will be releasing a <u>Professional Learning Platform</u> this spring for all school system employees at no cost to the school system. This user-friendly, statewide platform will house all professional learning and the <u>Professional Learning Partner Guide</u> in this one platform; professional learning modules and webinars will no longer live on the LDOE website. System and school level leaders will also be able to create professional learning modules in the platform.

The Professional Learning Platform Overview includes additional information on:

- creating EdLink credentials.
- requesting Canopy permissions.
- participating in Canopy Informational Webinars.
- completing online training in the Professional Learning Platform.



Statewide Quality Rating Scores

The 2021-2022 Performance profiles are the first public release of scores that reflect the shifts made through the Believe and Prepare initiative implemented in 2018. The state Quality Rating Scores are the highest since the accountability's inception in the 2017-2018 school year. Due to COVID, only one year of VAM is used in this year's calculation.

- The state undergraduate pathway score increased from 2.0 to 2.6, Level 3: Effective.
- The state post-baccalaureate pathway score increased from 2.4 to 2.8, Level 3: Effective.
- 78% of pathways increased their score or remained the same, and 85% of pathways increased their level or remained the same from the previous year.
- 52% of the pathways increased their domain score for Meeting Workforce Needs.

Science Sample Course Outline

The LDOE is excited to release the <u>Science Course Outline</u>. During the 2022-2023 school year the Department brought together teacher preparation faculty and K-12 science experts to develop a sample course outline for elementary science methods courses. This outline provides course objectives, activities, and assessments. It was created by leading science experts across Louisiana. Please share this resource with any science support staff.

As a reminder, we also have math and ELA sample course outlines in the Believe and Prepare <u>library</u>.



Learning Year Evaluator Training

All school systems will participate in the Learning Year during the 2024-2025 school year. The COMPASS evaluation system will not be used.

- Draft observation rubrics will be shared early 2024.
- Webinars will be held in the spring.

Face-to-face training for system and school leaders will take place this summer in nine regions across the state. Please see the <u>Louisiana Leader and Educator Rubric and Evaluation Training Guidance</u> for available dates within each region.

Teacher training will be available in August in the Professional Learning (PL) Platform. Additional resources will also be made available to systems.

Human Capital Handbook

The Department, in partnership with the Urban Schools Human Capital Academy, developed the <u>Human Capital Handbook</u>. The purpose of Louisiana's Human Capital Handbook is to provide relevant knowledge that school systems can use to implement a strategic Human Capital (HC) approach to ensure that school systems have a quality workforce.

Each chapter is structured with:

- a summary of the topic;
- an explanation of why this work is important;
- important data points;
- key steps to take; and
- a story of impact.

The Toolkit provides school systems with a variety of social media templates, marketing tools, and advertising designs such as fliers, brochures, and digital ads, that are completely customizable for the individual school system.



Teacher Leader Summit: Leading the Next Level

The 2024 Teacher Leader Summit is an annual professional learning conference that brings together Louisiana birth to grade 12 educators and content experts. Educators participating in the event will share their knowledge, learn new skills, and prepare for the 2024-2025 school year.

This year's Teacher Leader Summit will focus on our ability to lead the next level of our Vision for Success.

- The Teacher Leader Summit will take place from May 28 May 30, 2024, at the New Orleans Ernest N. Morial Convention Center (NOENMCC).
- Early Bird Registration will open January 5 and close February 2.



Professional Learning Partner Guide

School systems can begin using the <u>Professional Learning Partner Guide</u> (PLPG) as they begin planning for the 2024-2025 school year in the Super App. The PLPG, which streamlines all approved partners into a single guide, can help school systems connect with outside partners to meet their needs.

School systems can search the following guides:

- content leader and mentor teacher,
- educator certification and certificate programs,
- high school planning,
- early childhood ancillary certificate, and
- Jump Start training.



Professional Learning Partner Guide

The LDOE has released a single, comprehensive, digital guide of approved professional learning partners. Previously. the LDOE has produced over ten separate. static vendor guides for school systems to access as they choose the partners that best fit their needs. Based on feedback from partners and school systems, the dynamic Professional Learning Partner Guide (PLPG) is more accessible and user-friendly for school system leaders.





Geaux Teach Scholarship

The Geaux Teach Fund was established in the 2022 Regular Legislative Session with an allocation of \$5M for the purpose of awarding scholarships to students in teacher preparation programs. Students may receive up to \$5,000 annually to cover the cost of tuition fees, textbooks, and instructional materials required for enrollment. School systems are encouraged to share this information with future educators and educators enrolled in alternative certification programs.

2023 Mentor and Content Leader Training Provider Effectiveness Report

The 2023 Training Provider Effectiveness Report was received by BESE at the October board meeting. This report contains training and assessment data for Mentor and Content Leader training providers for participants that were enrolled in the assessment platform between 08/01/2020 - 7/31/2022.

The final report is available in the Mentor Teacher and Content Leader libraries.



Evaluation Updates

There are currently 17 Louisiana school systems participating in an evaluation pilot. These systems will use new tools and processes designed to provide support and feedback to educators to improve instruction and leadership. Feedback from the pilot will be used to inform adjustments prior to full implementation.

Evaluation Updates

Per Bulletin 130, all evaluators must renew certification annually. The <u>2023-2024</u> Rater Reliability Evaluator Training and <u>companion</u> are available in the <u>Compass Library</u>.

• The <u>2023-2024 Evaluation Guide for Teachers</u> is also available in the Compass Library.

Systems are encouraged to begin setting <u>Student Learning Targets (SLTs)</u> and conducting observations.

- Resources for setting SLTs are available in the Compass Library.
- Per Bulletin 130, evaluators and evaluatees must meet to discuss all SLTs.
- Per Bulletin 130, all educators will require two observations for the 2023-2024 school year.

Mentor Waiver

At the April BESE meeting, the Board approved a waiver for the Mentor policy for the 2023-2024 school year. Mentor teacher waivers will be granted on a case-by-case basis through the application process established by the LDOE and at no fee to the applicant, school system, or teacher preparation provider. The 2023-2024 Mentor Waiver application is currently open.

Mentor Waiver Applications should be created by the system leader responsible for resident placement and/or Mentor recruitment and support. The Mentor Credential Waiver Application guide provides step by step directions on the application process. Mentor waivers must be issued by October 1 for Mentors to be eligible for funding.





The <u>Louisiana Pre-Educator Pathway</u> is a Grow Your Own initiative focused on high quality early career development for the next generation of Louisiana's educators. In the 2023-2024 school year, a series of supports will be offered to support Louisiana school systems in the development, implementation, and expansion of the Louisiana Pre-Educator Pathway.

Associate Teacher Program

Under ACT No. 99 of the 2023 Regular Legislative Session, the State of Louisiana now allows schools to hire candidates holding an associate's degree who are enrolled in a teacher education preparation program to serve as a teacher of record. The authorization for the associate teacher to be a teacher of record is issued by the school system, not the LDOE.

To be eligible for the Associate Teacher Program, the candidate must:

- Have an associate's degree from an accredited college or university.
- Be continuously enrolled in an undergraduate teacher education program at an accredited college or university for the purpose of obtaining a bachelor's degree.
- Be at least twenty-five years of age.



Professional Learning Roadmap

A key component of overall school system strategic planning is the implementation of a comprehensive professional learning plan.

The Professional Learning Roadmap intends to guide and support school system and school leaders in their implementation of essential professional learning structures: school system instructional leadership team, school instructional leadership team, and teacher collaboration.





Mentor and Content Leader Training

As a reminder all CIR schools must have a trained Mentor, ELA content leader, and math content leader. School systems recently received notification regarding their Super App funding to support this work.

School systems should use the <u>Mentor and Content Leader Training Vendor</u> <u>Guide</u> to select an approved training program. The guide has been updated to include all newly approved programs.



Staffing and Scheduling

School systems may use the <u>Staffing and Scheduling Best Practices Guidance</u> to assist in making staffing and scheduling decisions aligned to the best practices below for the 2023-2024 school year.

- High-quality core instruction is the foundation.
- Effective literacy instruction is central to student success.
- Students with unfinished learning and diverse learners need extra instructional time.
- Both core instruction and acceleration must be provided by content strong staff.
- Meeting the various needs of students supports academic achievement.
- Access and opportunities should be at the forefront of all these strategies.



Praxis Exams Adopted

Earlier this month, BESE adopted two new Praxis exams:

- Computer Science (5652), effective 6/1/24, score 149
- Louisiana Elementary Multiple Subjects Exam (7001), effective 6/1/24
 - Includes:
 - Reading Language Arts (7002) includes the incorporation of the Teaching of Reading exam
 - Mathematics (7003)
 - Social Studies (7004)
 - Science (7005)



Certification Simplification

Policy adopted at January BESE simplified certification. New endorsements or changes to existing endorsements were added to allow an educator to maintain a single teaching certificate:

- Artist (Art, Creative Writing, Drama, Dance, Music, Theater, Visual Arts)
- Talented (Music, Theater, Visual Arts)
- Librarian (additional options)



Certification Status Changes

Certification renewal is based upon effective evaluations in a Louisiana approved school.

Non-Practicing status:

- Teachers or leaders who are not serving/employed or who are serving in another state/country
- Educators serving on Educational Leader certificates (EDL) should place their teaching certificates into non-practicing status
 - EDL would be placed into non-practicing while serving on the teaching certificate
- The requested **effective date** of non-practicing status should be the **last** date of employment in the evaluated role, within the certificate's validity, no earlier than August 1, 2012

Certification Status Changes

Certification renewal is based upon effective evaluations via Compass.

Operational Role status:

- Teachers who are serving in a public school setting in roles that cannot be evaluated per student growth measures via Compass
- Operational Role status shall take effect on the first day of employment in a role that cannot be evaluated per student growth measures
- **EDL** certificates **are not** placed into operational role

Accurate experience verification forms must be included with all status change requests. Requests for Operational Role should include a **job description** to determine eligibility. This is now noted on the updated experience verification form available in the October 2023 published Renewal, Higher, Status change application.

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Reinstatement of Lifetime Certificates

Lifetime certificates lapse for disuse if the educator does not serve as a teacher for five consecutive years without being regularly employed for at least one semester, or 90 consecutive days, as a teacher.

Lapsed certificates may be reinstated for a five-year period at the request of an employing school system.

At least three effective ratings during the five-year reactivation period must be earned to reinstate **lifetime** validity.



Certification Evaluation Updates


During the 2023 Legislative Session, Act 63 provides for the crediting of evaluations in a variety of settings towards the maintenance of certification. Act 63 allows for the use of successful evaluations in the following settings:

- Out-of-State (OS)
- In-state nonpublic
- Contracted or third party educators
- Allows for 'mixing' of evaluation types

Updates regarding these changes are included in sections 103, 507, and 519 of the proposed revisions for Bulletin 746 being heard at August BESE.

<u>Level Up: School Improvement Best Practices</u> training, required for CIR schools for the 2024-2025 school year, will be delivered at Teacher Leader Summit 2024.

- The Department will fund TLS registration for a 3-member ILT (principal & two others) from each CIR school.
- The Division of School Improvement will collect the names of the ILT members from each CIR school to be registered. Level Up attendees should not use the regular TLS registration.
- One full day session of Level Up is required and will be pre-loaded for participants. Participants will be able to register for other TLS sessions outside of their scheduled Level Up day.
