






Significant Increase in Zearn Math Data

Significant Increase in Zearn Math Data





Special Education Camera Maintenance Fund

April Dunn Act Implementation Monitoring

To support the effective implementation of the April Dunn Act, the LDOE created the April Dunn Act Self-Assessment Guide (SAG).

This guide is a comprehensive analysis of the implementation process, including the review of procedures and data to determine valid and systemic conclusions.

When completed with fidelity, the SAG will be helpful in identifying any root causes of performance and implementation issues in your LEA.

April Dunn Act Self-Assessment Guide

Beginning February 2024, self-assessments should be conducted annually.

April Dunn Act Monitoring

For the 2023-2024 school year, school systems are required to complete Section One of the self-assessment by **February 29**. Sections Two and Three are not required but strongly recommended.

Self-assessment results should be kept on file. The Department will audit self-assessment results to ensure they accurately represent best practices in the implementation of the April Dunn Act.

Literacy



Act 522: K-3 Literacy Priorities

- Literacy Screener all K-3 students, 3x per year with parent reporting within 15 days
 - Available reports in DIBELS platform
 - Caretaker Report shares data with explanation of measures
 - Home Connect Report at-home literacy activities
- Individual Reading Improvement Plans for all students below proficiency
- School Literacy Plans posted on website
- Literacy Coach to support teachers



Act 108: Foundational Literacy Training

- Act 108 requires training for K-3 teachers and administrators based on the science of reading.
- School systems must report to the Department on successful training completion.
- Schools and school systems must begin requiring teachers and administrators to complete at least one approved professional development course by the 2023-2024 school year.
- Any teacher or administrator hired after August 1, 2023, must provide proof of successful completion within two years of employment.



Bulletin 1566: 3rd & 4th Grade Summer Learning

Beginning with the 2022-2023 school year, and continuing through the summer following the 2023-2024 school year, any student enrolled in third or fourth grade and scoring below grade-level on the end-of-the-year LDOE-approved literacy assessment shall receive a minimum of 30 hours of explicit literacy instruction inclusive of targeted interventions during the summer or risk retention.

- No tuition or fees can be charged for the attendance of an eligible student, and transportation must be offered.
- The LEA may waive the state policy for students scoring below grade-level for students with an IEP at the discretion of the IEP team.



Act 422: Third Grade Retention

Prohibits promotion to the fourth grade of certain students whose reading deficiencies have not been remediated by the end of the third grade.

- Literacy screening
- Individual reading plan
- Exceptions for good cause
- Required instructional services to retained students

Transitional 9th Graders Literacy Grant

- Innovation Grant Up to \$150,000 to support increasing literacy outcomes for transitional 9th grade students.
- Applications should be submitted to <u>louisianaliteracy@la.gov</u> by February 8.
- Grant awards are made available for July 1, 2024 June 30, 2025.
- All public high schools are included, not just those with labels.



Educator Development



Annual Teacher Exit Survey Released

The annual <u>Teacher Exit Survey</u> highlights the progress of Louisiana's comprehensive recruitment and retention strategy. This past year saw the following improvement:

- For the first time in four years, there was an increase in the total teacher workforce.
- The rate of exiting teachers decreased one percentage point from 14 to 13 percent.
- Top 3 reasons for teachers exiting their current position remain the same: personal reasons, transferring to another Louisiana school system, and retirement.

Aspiring Principal Fellowship Application Available

In an effort to support the development of school leaders across the state, the LDOE will be launching the fourth cohort of the Aspiring Principal Fellowship for the 2024-2025 school year.

Applicants must hold a current EDL1 certification in Louisiana. School systems need to cover the cost of the \$1,000 tuition for presenters and materials, as well as travel costs. Interested candidates should complete the Aspiring Principal Fellowship Application no later than March 8. Fellowship applicants will be notified of acceptance by March 28.

Recruitment and Retention Fellowship Application Available

In an effort to support human resources professionals in recruitment and retention efforts, the LDOE is expanding the Recruitment and Retention Fellowship for a fifth cohort for 2024-2025. The fellowship gives Louisiana human resources professionals the opportunity to collaborate with human capital professionals from across Louisiana and the country to learn best practices for attracting and retaining effective educators.

Mentor Funding

School Systems received Mentor funding in mid-January. System leads also received an email with a list of Mentors eligible for funding on January 12.

If a school system did not receive funding for a Mentor the most likely reason for ineligibility is:

- The Mentor was not coded as 112, teacher.
- The Mentor did not possess the required Mentor certification or Mentor waiver by October 1, 2023.
- The resident they supported did not hold their required certification (PL or resident license) by October 1, 2023.

Pre-K Mentor Funding

Mentors coded as Pre-K teachers are not eligible for MFP Mentor funding. School systems receive funding for these Mentors through an allocation in EGMs, using 8g funding.

If your school system reported an eligible Pre-K Mentor, the system lead should have received an email following the January BESE meeting with details about accessing this funding in EGMs.

Pre-Educator Curriculum

The LDOE is creating a pre-educator pathway open-source curriculum that will be free to all school systems.

The curriculum materials should be available to school systems for use by December 2024.

The selected vendor will be relying on the expertise of Louisiana educators across the state. More details about opportunities to engage in the development of these materials will be provide in the coming months.



NTOY Application Deadline

School systems are encouraged to select up to three candidates for the state level competition New Teacher of the Year.

The applications for the New Teacher of the Year are due on **January 26.**

All state level candidates are asked to submit all materials through the New Teacher of the Year application portal.



2024-2025 Evaluation Learning Year

All school systems will participate in the 2024-2025 Evaluation Learning Year. Key Improvements for Educator and Leader Evaluation include:

- Grounded in evidence-based practices that enhance teaching and leadership practices;
- A more fair and transparent process that includes multiple measures, supports self reflection, and gives teachers a voice;
- **Better feedback** for improvement and resources to support individual growth; and
- Stronger connections between evaluation and professional learning.

Summer Evaluation Learning Year Training

Training for all system and school leaders and observers will take place this summer. The <u>Leader and Educator Rubric and Evaluation Training Guidance</u> provides details on the summer training.

Counselor Evaluation

The Louisiana Department of Education is gathering feedback to inform improvements to the counselor evaluation process. All school counselors are asked to complete the Counselor Evaluation Survey by January 30. Please share with all school counselors.

The first draft of the Louisiana Counselor Rubric will be shared with school counselors at the Spring 2024 Counselor Support Institutes. Please encourage school counselors to register and attend to provide feedback.



Professional Learning Platform

The LDOE will be releasing a <u>Professional Learning Platform</u> this spring for all school system employees at no cost to the school system. This user-friendly, statewide platform will house all professional learning and the <u>Professional Learning Partner Guide</u> in this one platform; professional learning modules and webinars will no longer live on the LDOE website. System and school level leaders will also be able to create professional learning modules in the platform.

Professional Learning Platform

School systems can continue providing their employees EdLink credentials and Canopy permissions. All Louisiana educators will need to have a MyLa account and EdLink credentials. Encourage your superintendent to opt-In through EdLink Security to grant all classroom teachers a role in Canopy. For school systems that have not opted-in, the LEA Security Coordinator will have to manually approve each teacher's Canopy Learner request.

Act 266 (HB 69) Dyslexia Screening Update

Screener Requirements

- LDOE to select and provide to each public school (at no cost) a dyslexia screener with the following requirements:
 - o area under curve of 0.80 or above
 - developed solely for dyslexia
 - evidence-based with proven, published psychometric validity
 - o used to determine if a student is at risk
- To be administered by a teacher in second half of kindergarten or any time requested by a teacher or parent/guardian
- Within 30 days of at risk results the parent is to be notified

 While the LDOE works to complete the Request for Proposals (RFP) procurement process, systems will continue to utilize the screening tool that has been administered in the past.



Grades 3-5 Modified ELA Guidebook Units


ELA Modified Guidebook Guide 3-5 addresses Louisiana Connectors for students with significant cognitive disabilities.

Guidebook text modifications include

an overall summary of the text with shortened story length, enlarged font size, utilization of graphics, bolded vocabulary words in a different font color, and gray background color.

Student materials include

a vocabulary chart, table identifying main characters, and materials to test the learner's knowledge.





Literacy Alternate Assessment Rubric

K-3 students who are determined eligible by the IEP team for alternate assessments using the K-2 Alternate Assessment Participation

Decision-Making Tool or the 3-11 alternate assessment criteria may use the Literacy Alternate Assessment Rubric.

Alternate assessments are reserved for the approximately 1% of students.


Strong Foundational Literacy Skills in Grades 4-8

K-3 Literacy Screener

State law mandates that all students in kindergarten through third grade participate in a single statewide literacy screening three times per year. This includes students with IEPs or IAPs, English learners, non-readers and students who qualify for alternate assessment based on the K-2 Alternate Assessment Participation Decision-making Tool for K-2 and the LEAP Connect criteria for Grade 3.

Selection of Statewide Screener

Amplify was chosen as the vendor for the statewide screener that will be used by all public school systems for the mandated screening.

Amplify: The name of the publisher providing the testing platform

mCLASS: The name of the screening technology platform

DIBELS 8th: The name of the actual screening instrument (this is the same screener that was used in the fall by all school systems)

For 2023-2024, a one time only extension will be provided in December due to contract delays.

 December 1-January 26: Regular reported screener required of all students, including those selected for field test.

All screenings shall be done in the Amplify platform. Paper and pencil will not be accepted.



Screener Reporting

The statewide Amplify program will provide real-time reports to schools and systems.

All results for screening in the Amplify platform to the department will be completed by the vendor. Schools and systems will NOT send results, with the exception of scores from LAAR. As there is no need for the Composite Score Calculator, it is being removed from the website.

Results from field testing will not be reported.

- Information is also provided for families to enroll eligible students in the <u>Steve Carter Literacy Tutoring Program</u>.



Statewide Quality Rating Scores

The 2021-2022 Performance profiles are the first public release of scores that reflect the shifts made through the Believe and Prepare initiative implemented in 2018. The state Quality Rating Scores are the highest since the accountability's inception in the 2017-2018 school year. Due to COVID, only one year of VAM is used in this year's calculation.

- The state undergraduate pathway score increased from 2.0 to 2.6, Level 3: Effective.
- The state post-baccalaureate pathway score increased from 2.4 to 2.8, Level 3: Effective.
- 78% of pathways increased their score or remained the same, and 85% of pathways increased their level or remained the same from the previous year.
- 52% of the pathways increased their domain score for Meeting Workforce Needs.

Learning Year Evaluator Training

All school systems will participate in the Learning Year during the 2024-2025 school year. The COMPASS evaluation system will not be used.

- Draft observation rubrics will be shared early 2024.
- Webinars will be held in the spring.

Face-to-face training for system and school leaders will take place this summer in nine regions across the state. Please see the <u>Louisiana Leader and Educator Rubric and Evaluation Training Guidance</u> for available dates within each region.

Teacher training will be available in August in the Professional Learning (PL) Platform. Additional resources will also be made available to systems.

The purpose of Louisiana's Human Capital Handbook is to provide relevant knowledge that school systems can use to implement a strategic Human Capital (HC) approach to ensure that school systems have a quality workforce.

Professional Learning Partner Guide

School systems can begin using the <u>Professional Learning Partner Guide</u> (PLPG) as they begin planning for the 2024-2025 school year in the Super App. The PLPG, which streamlines all approved partners into a single guide, can help school systems connect with outside partners to meet their needs.

School systems can search the following guides:

- content leader and mentor teacher,
- educator certification and certificate programs,

- early childhood ancillary certificate, and

Professional Learning Partner Guide

The LDOE has released a single, comprehensive, digital guide of approved professional learning partners. Previously, the LDOE has produced over ten separate. static vendor guides for school systems to access as they choose the partners that best fit their needs. Based on feedback from partners and school systems, the dynamic Professional Learning Partner Guide (PLPG) is more accessible and user-friendly for school system leaders.





Geaux Teach Scholarship

The Geaux Teach Fund was established in the 2022 Regular Legislative Session with an allocation of \$5M for the purpose of awarding scholarships to students in teacher preparation programs. Students may receive up to \$5,000 annually to cover the cost of tuition fees, textbooks, and instructional materials required for enrollment. School systems are encouraged to share this information with future educators and educators enrolled in alternative certification programs.

2023 Mentor and Content Leader Training Provider Effectiveness Report

The 2023 Training Provider Effectiveness Report was received by BESE at the October board meeting. This report contains training and assessment data for Mentor and Content Leader training providers for participants that were enrolled in the assessment platform between 08/01/2020 - 7/31/2022.

The final report is available in the <u>Mentor Teacher</u> and <u>Content Leader</u> libraries.



Evaluation Updates

There are currently 17 Louisiana school systems participating in an evaluation pilot. These systems will use new tools and processes designed to provide support and feedback to educators to improve instruction and leadership. Feedback from the pilot will be used to inform adjustments prior to full implementation.

Evaluation Updates

Per Bulletin 130, all evaluators must renew certification annually. The <u>2023-2024</u> Rater Reliability Evaluator Training and <u>companion</u> are available in the <u>Compass Library</u>.

• The <u>2023-2024 Evaluation Guide for Teachers</u> is also available in the Compass Library.

Systems are encouraged to begin setting <u>Student Learning Targets (SLTs)</u> and conducting observations.

- Resources for setting SLTs are available in the Compass Library.
- Per Bulletin 130, evaluators and evaluatees must meet to discuss all SLTs.
- Per Bulletin 130, all educators will require two observations for the 2023-2024 school year.

Mentor Waiver

At the April BESE meeting, the Board approved a waiver for the Mentor policy for the 2023-2024 school year. Mentor teacher waivers will be granted on a case-by-case basis through the application process established by the LDOE and at no fee to the applicant, school system, or teacher preparation provider. The 2023-2024 Mentor Waiver application is currently open.

Mentor Waiver Applications should be created by the system leader responsible for resident placement and/or Mentor recruitment and support. The Mentor Credential Waiver Application guide provides step by step directions on the application process. Mentor waivers must be issued by October 1 for Mentors to be eligible for funding.





The Louisiana Pre-Educator Pathway is a Grow Your Own initiative focused on high quality early career development for the next generation of Louisiana's educators. In the 2023-2024 school year, a series of supports will be offered to support Louisiana school systems in the development, implementation, and expansion of the Louisiana Pre-Educator Pathway.

Associate Teacher Program

Under ACT No. 99 of the 2023 Regular Legislative Session, the State of Louisiana now allows schools to hire candidates holding an associate's degree who are enrolled in a teacher education preparation program to serve as a teacher of record. The authorization for the associate teacher to be a teacher of record is issued by the school system, not the LDOE.

To be eligible for the Associate Teacher Program, the candidate must:

- Have an associate's degree from an accredited college or university.
- Be continuously enrolled in an undergraduate teacher education program at an accredited college or university for the purpose of obtaining a bachelor's degree.
- Be at least twenty-five years of age.



Professional Learning Roadmap

A key component of overall school system strategic planning is the implementation of a comprehensive professional learning plan.

The <u>Professional Learning Roadmap</u> intends to guide and support school system and school leaders in their implementation of essential professional learning structures: school system instructional leadership team, school instructional leadership team, and teacher collaboration.





Mentor and Content Leader Training

As a reminder all CIR schools must have a trained Mentor, ELA content leader, and math content leader. School systems recently received notification regarding their Super App funding to support this work.

School systems should use the <u>Mentor and Content Leader Training Vendor</u> <u>Guide</u> to select an approved training program. The guide has been updated to include all newly approved programs.




Staffing and Scheduling

School systems may use the <u>Staffing and Scheduling Best Practices Guidance</u> to assist in making staffing and scheduling decisions aligned to the best practices below for the 2023-2024 school year.

- High-quality core instruction is the foundation.
- Effective literacy instruction is central to student success.
- Students with unfinished learning and diverse learners need extra instructional time.
- Both core instruction and acceleration must be provided by content strong staff.
- Meeting the various needs of students supports academic achievement.
- Access and opportunities should be at the forefront of all these strategies.

- One full day session of Level Up is required and will be pre-loaded for participants. Participants will be able to register for other TLS sessions outside of their scheduled Level Up day.



Reminders & Repeats Certification



Certification Status Changes

Certification renewal is based upon effective evaluations in a Louisiana approved school.

Non-Practicing status:

- Teachers or leaders who are not serving/employed or who are serving in another state/country
- Educators serving on Educational Leader certificates (EDL) should place their teaching certificates into non-practicing status
 - EDL would be placed into non-practicing while serving on the teaching certificate
- The requested **effective date** of non-practicing status should be the **last** date of employment in the evaluated role, within the certificate's validity, no earlier than August 1, 2012

Certification Status Changes

Certification renewal is based upon effective evaluations via Compass.

Operational Role status:

- Teachers who are serving in a public school setting in roles that cannot be evaluated per student growth measures via Compass
- Operational Role status shall take effect on the first day of employment in a role that cannot be evaluated per student growth measures
- EDL certificates are not placed into operational role

Accurate experience verification forms must be included with all status change requests. Requests for Operational Role should include a **job description** to determine eligibility. This is now noted on the updated experience verification form available in the October 2023 published Renewal, Higher, Status change application.

Reinstatement of Lifetime Certificates

Lifetime certificates **lapse for disuse** if the educator does not serve as a teacher for five consecutive years without being regularly employed for at least one semester, or 90 consecutive days, as a teacher.

Lapsed certificates may be **reinstated for a five-year** period at the request of an employing school system.

At least three effective ratings during the five-year reactivation period must be earned to reinstate lifetime validity.



Certification Evaluation Updates

During the 2023 Legislative Session, Act 63 provides for the crediting of evaluations in a variety of settings towards the maintenance of certification. Act 63 allows for the use of successful evaluations in the following settings:

- Out-of-State (OS)
- In-state nonpublic
- Contracted or third party educators
- Allows for 'mixing' of evaluation types

Updates regarding these changes are included in sections 103, 507, and 519 of the proposed revisions for Bulletin 746 being heard at August BESE.
