ESSER III Amended Liquidation Protocols

To afford LEAs the fullest range of flexibility in drawing down the ESSER III funding, LDOE has implemented amended liquidation protocols given the recent flexibilities provided by ED.

Amended protocols apply to ESSER III funding only and allow additional time to liquidate:

- Goods
- Services
- Construction projects

Contracts must still be in place and purchase order requisitions must be submitted by September 30, 2024. LEAs will have until **December 16, 2024** to receive goods and complete services and construction projects.

To maximize the drawdown of ESSER III funding, the LDOE will begin looking at the potential to reallocate unobligated ESSER III funding. School systems will report unobligated funding (funding that will not be obligated on or before 09/30/2024) in eGMS through the Achieve! Application this month and then again in August.



Leader Evaluation Process

Middle-of-Year formative conference to review goals, the leader's self-assessment, ask questions, provide coaching, and discuss next steps.



Beginning-of-Year initial conference with the leader where rubric is reviewed, and the leader shares his/her goals for the year in order to create an action plan.

End-of-Year summative conference with the leader to review goals, the leader's self-assessment, ask coaching questions, and discuss next steps.





This guide will continue to be updated as additional units are published.






To support the effective implementation of the April Dunn Act, the LDOE created the <u>April Dunn Act Self-Assessment Guide</u> (SAG).





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
Bulletin 1566: 3rd & 4th Grade Summer Learning

Beginning with the 2022-2023 school year, and continuing through the summer following the 2023-2024 school year, any student enrolled in third or fourth grade and scoring below grade-level on the end-of-the-year LDOE-approved literacy assessment shall receive a minimum of 30 hours of explicit literacy instruction inclusive of targeted interventions during the summer or risk retention.

- No tuition or fees can be charged for the attendance of an eligible student, and transportation must be offered.
- The LEA may waive the state policy for students scoring below grade-level for students with an IEP at the discretion of the IEP team.

LEADS Summer Evaluation Training

Systems opting to transition to the LEADS evaluation system should register for summer training. The <u>registration landing page</u> has now been updated and includes a waiting list.

- System level leaders and school leaders will complete a two-day Louisiana Leader Evaluation Training and pass a certification assessment prior to evaluating leaders with the Louisiana Leader Evaluation System.
- System level leaders, school level leaders, and designated observers will complete a three-day Louisiana Educator Evaluation Training and pass a certification assessment prior to observing with the Louisiana Educator Rubric. Note: Those currently certified on the NIET Teaching and Learning Standards Rubric may qualify for a one-day training.



Louisiana Educator Evaluation System

- Louisiana Educator Rubric (LER): A research-based rubric that helps build a common language, and is correlated with student achievement and growth
- **Training and Certification:** A process that leads to more fair and reliable educator evaluations by certified observers
- **Formal Observations:** Each observation is followed by a post-conference where teachers are supported in reflecting on the lesson
- **Professionalism Domain:** This domain on the Louisiana Rubric allows for the assessment and acknowledgement of teacher growth and reflection, community involvement, and school responsibilities
- **Self-assessment:** A reflection opportunity that leads to greater teacher voice in the evaluation process
- Follow-up coaching and support cycles: High-quality post-observation feedback, with an aligned coaching and support cycle, will enhance teacher growth

- **Training and Certification:** A process that leads to more fair and reliable leader evaluations by certified observers
- **Beginning-of-Year (BOY) Conference:** School leaders receive support with goal-setting, action-planning, and establishing a climate of continuous growth
- **Middle-of-Year (MOY) Conference:** School leaders are supported in reflection on successes and evidence of progress toward goals, revisions to the action plan, and reflection on indicator ratings
- End-of-Year (EOY) Conference: School leaders are supported in a summative reflection on evidence of goal attainment, strengths and growth areas, and indicator ratings
- **Self-assessment:** A reflection opportunity that leads to greater leader voice in the evaluation process
- School Principal Survey: Affords teachers the opportunity to give feedback on principal impact (only school principals)

Annual Teacher Exit Survey Released

The annual <u>Teacher Exit Survey</u> highlights the progress of Louisiana's comprehensive recruitment and retention strategy. This past year saw the following improvement:

- For the first time in four years, there was an increase in the total teacher workforce.
- The rate of exiting teachers decreased one percentage point from 14 to 13 percent.
- Top 3 reasons for teachers exiting their current position remain the same: personal reasons, transferring to another Louisiana school system, and retirement.

Statewide Quality Rating Scores

The 2021-2022 Performance profiles are the first public release of scores that reflect the shifts made through the Believe and Prepare initiative implemented in 2018. The state Quality Rating Scores are the highest since the accountability's inception in the 2017-2018 school year. Due to COVID, only one year of VAM is used in this year's calculation.

- The state undergraduate pathway score increased from 2.0 to 2.6, Level 3: Effective.
- The state post-baccalaureate pathway score increased from 2.4 to 2.8, Level 3: Effective.
- 78% of pathways increased their score or remained the same, and 85% of pathways increased their level or remained the same from the previous year.
- 52% of the pathways increased their domain score for Meeting Workforce Needs.



Science Sample Course Outline

The LDOE is excited to release the <u>Science Course Outline</u>. During the 2022-2023 school year the Department brought together teacher preparation faculty and K-12 science experts to develop a sample course outline for elementary science methods courses. School systems are encouraged to share this information with future educators and educators enrolled in alternative certification programs.

Mentor Waiver

At the April BESE meeting, the Board approved a waiver for the Mentor policy for the 2023-2024 school year. Mentor teacher waivers will be granted on a case-by-case basis through the application process established by the LDOE and at no fee to the applicant, school system, or teacher preparation provider. The 2023-2024 Mentor Waiver <u>application</u> is currently open.

<u>Mentor Waiver Applications</u> should be created by the **system leader** responsible for resident placement and/or Mentor recruitment and support. The <u>Mentor Credential</u> <u>Waiver Application guide</u> provides step by step directions on the application process. Mentor waivers must be issued by October 1 for Mentors to be eligible for funding.

Associate Teacher Program

Under <u>ACT No. 99</u> of the 2023 Regular Legislative Session, the State of Louisiana now allows schools to hire candidates holding an associate's degree who are enrolled in a teacher education preparation program to serve as a teacher of record. **The authorization for the associate teacher to be a teacher of record is issued by the school system, not the LDOE.**

To be eligible for the Associate Teacher Program, the candidate must:

- Have an associate's degree from an accredited college or university.
- Be continuously enrolled in an undergraduate teacher education program at an accredited college or university for the purpose of obtaining a bachelor's degree.
- Be at least twenty-five years of age.

Professional Learning Roadmap

A key component of overall school system strategic planning is the implementation of a comprehensive professional learning plan.

The <u>Professional Learning Roadmap</u> intends to guide and support school system and school leaders in their implementation of essential professional learning structures: school system instructional leadership team, school instructional leadership team, and teacher collaboration.



Mentor and Content Leader Training

As a reminder all CIR schools must have a trained Mentor, ELA content leader, and math content leader. School systems recently received notification regarding their Super App funding to support this work.

School systems should use the <u>Mentor and Content Leader Training Vendor</u> <u>Guide</u> to select an approved training program. The guide has been updated to include all newly approved programs.

Certification Simplification

Policy adopted at January BESE simplified certification. New endorsements or changes to existing endorsements were added to allow an educator to maintain a single teaching certificate:

- Artist (Art, Creative Writing, Drama, Dance, Music, Theater, Visual Arts)
- Talented (Music, Theater, Visual Arts)
- Librarian (additional options)

Certification Status Changes

Certification renewal is based upon effective evaluations in a Louisiana approved school.

Non-Practicing status:

- Teachers or leaders who are **not serving/employed** or who are serving in another state/country
- Educators **serving on Educational Leader** certificates (EDL) should place their **teaching** certificates into **non-practicing** status
 - EDL would be placed into non-practicing while serving on the teaching certificate
- The requested effective date of non-practicing status should be the last date of employment in the evaluated role, within the certificate's validity, no earlier than August 1, 2012



Certification Status Changes

Certification renewal is based upon effective evaluations via Compass.

Operational Role status:

- **Teachers** who are serving in a public school setting in roles that **cannot be** evaluated per student growth measures via Compass
- Operational Role status shall take effect on the **first day of employment** in a role that **cannot be evaluated per student growth measures**
- EDL certificates are not placed into operational role

Accurate experience verification forms must be included with all status change requests. Requests for Operational Role should include a **job description** to determine eligibility. This is now noted on the updated experience verification form available in the October 2023 published Renewal, Higher, Status change application.

Reinstatement of Lifetime Certificates

Lifetime certificates **lapse for disuse** if the educator does not serve as a teacher for five consecutive years without being regularly employed for at least one semester, or 90 consecutive days, as a teacher.

Lapsed certificates may be **reinstated for a five-year** period at the request of an employing school system.

At least **three effective ratings during the five-year reactivation period** must be earned to reinstate **lifetime** validity.

Certification Evaluation Updates

During the 2023 Legislative Session, Act 63 provides for the crediting of evaluations in a variety of settings towards the maintenance of certification. Act 63 allows for the use of successful evaluations in the following settings:

- Out-of-State (OS)
- In-state nonpublic
- Contracted or third party educators
- Allows for 'mixing' of evaluation types

Updates regarding these changes are included in sections 103, 507, and 519 of the proposed revisions for Bulletin 746 being heard at August BESE.
