



Act 517 Compliance Reviews Status Report

On June 21, 2022, Louisiana lawmakers signed <u>Act S12</u> into law to ensure that all textbooks and instructional materials used to teach students to read are high-quality, fully aligned to state content standards, and based on literacy strategies that are scientifically researched with proven results in teaching phonological awareness, letter formation, phonics, decoding, fluency, vocabulary, and comprehension. As part of the Louisiana Department of Education's support for a seamless transition to textbooks and instructional materials that are based on scientifically-researched literacy strategies, the LDOE identified the criterion and indicators used to review instructional materials that were impacted as a result of this legislation.

The LDOE reached out to publishers with posted Tier 1 or Tier 2 state reviews that include foundational skills and requested access to their instructional materials to examine for the following changes in alignment resulting from Act 517:

- Instructional materials and embedded assessments do not require or encourage the three-cueing system model of reading (students gaining meaning from print through Semantic, Syntactic, or Grapho-phonic cues) in reading instruction;
- Instructional materials and embedded assessments do not require or encourage visual memory as the primary basis for word recognition; and/or
- . Instructional materials and embedded assessments do not require or encourage MSV (Meaning, Structure, and Visual) cues in reading instruction.


VAM will be released into the Compass Information System (CIS) on October 6.




Evaluation Updates


Summit Extensions 2023-2024




The New Teacher Experience Professional Learning Modules




Mentor and Resident Funding

In the 2023-2024 academic year, the data collection for Mentor compensation will take place using a similar process to what was used in 2022-2023. Those unable to join the Fall 2023 Mentor and Resident Funding call to review the funding eligibility and process should review the posted PowerPoint deck.

School systems must submit all required data no later than **October 20** in EdLink. All certificates required (Practitioner License, Resident license, Mentor credential or waiver) must be issued by **October 1** in order to be eligible for funding.

Mentor Waiver

At the April BESE meeting, the Board approved a waiver for the Mentor policy for the 2023-2024 school year. Mentor teacher waivers will be granted on a case-by-case basis through the application process established by the LDOE and at no fee to the applicant, school system, or teacher preparation provider. The 2023-2024 Mentor Waiver application is currently open.

Mentor Waiver Applications should be created by the **system leader** responsible for resident placement and/or Mentor recruitment and support. The Mentor Credential Waiver Application guide provides step by step directions on the application process. Mentor waivers must be issued by **October 1** for Mentors to be eligible for funding.



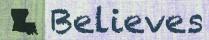
Associate Teacher Program

Under <u>ACT No. 99</u> of the 2023 Regular Legislative Session, the State of Louisiana now allows schools to hire candidates holding an associate's degree who are enrolled in a teacher education preparation program to serve as a teacher of record. **The authorization for the associate teacher to be a teacher of record is issued by the LEA, not the LDOE.**

To be eligible for the Associate Teacher Program, the candidate must:

- Have an associate's degree from an accredited college or university.
- Be continuously enrolled in an undergraduate teacher education program at an accredited college or university for the purpose of obtaining a bachelor's degree.
- Be at least twenty-five years of age.




Mentor and Content Leader Training




Staffing and Scheduling

Certification Evaluation Updates

During the 2023 Legislative Session, Act 63 provides for the crediting of evaluations in a variety of settings towards the maintenance of certification. Act 63 allows for the use of successful evaluations in the following settings:

- Out-of-State (OS)
- In-state nonpublic
- Contracted or third party educators
- Allows for 'mixing' of evaluation types

Updates regarding these changes are included in sections 103, 507, and 519 of the proposed revisions for Bulletin 746 being heard at August BESE.
