


B-3 Seats for 2023-2024

Community Network Lead Agencies will receive an invitation for an extended Office Hours in the coming weeks to discuss the 2023-2024 distribution of funds to cover Birth to Three seats in their community.

Due to additional funding received for early childhood education seats, the LDOE will be continuing the B-3 Seats pilot in 2023-2024 and will be distributing additional funds to Community Network Lead Agencies that requested seats in the most recent Coordinated Funding Request, submitted in January 2023.

Funding amounts and logic, allowable uses, and next steps will be shared at these extended office hours, which will be held immediately following the August 8 CNLA office hours. Calendar invitations were sent on Friday July 28.




CLASS® Pre-K-3rd 2nd Edition Certification for New Observers









Viewing Roster Comments

Clicking **View** will open the data certification roster and allow the user to view responses from the LDOE in the Responses tab.







Using the Response Tab

Entering informational metrics that do not reflect what was true on October 1, 2022 .	Use <u>teachlouisiana.net</u> to verify that certification information was true as of October 1, 2022 (ensure CNLAs frame the capturing of informational metrics to site leaders as a snapshot of what was true on October 1).
Leaving informational metrics blank	Complete every field; otherwise, the field will default to "none."
Saving changes to a record without officially submitting	Click "Submit All Eligible Records for Review" after reviewing, finalizing, and saving all changes made to records. Once submitted, CNLAs will no longer have access to the system for additional edits.

:Who is Eligible?

Children and youth who lack a fixed, regular, and adequate nighttime residence.



Sharing the housing of others due to loss of housing, economic hardship, or similar reasons.



Living in motels, hotels, trailer parks, or camping grounds due to lack of alternative adequate accommodations.



Living in emergency or transitional shelters.



Living in cars, parks, abandoned buildings, substandard housing, bus or train stations, or similar settings.



DEFINITION

UnaccompaniedYouth

A child or youth without a fixed, regular, and adequate nighttime residence and not in the physical custody of a parent or guardian.



Youth run away from home due to abuse or neglect.

- 40-60% of unaccompanied youth were abused physically at home.
- 17-25% of unaccompanied youth were abused sexually at home.
- Research links parental substance abuse and youth running away from home



Parents force youth out of the home due to conflicts.

- Sexual orientation and gender identity


McKinney-Vento Act requires liaisons to proactively identify children and youth experiencing homelessness and ensure enrollment in Head Start and ECE programs.For public PreK, provides immediate enrollment, stability, transportation.

Categorical eligibility.for homeless families. Also requires proactive outreach, grace periods for immunizations, prioritized enrollment. Allows programs to reserve slots. Requires prioritization, use of funds for outreach and enrollment of homeless families, expedited enrollment.

Requires programs serving families to designate a staff person to ensure enrollment in early childhood programs and school.

Families often stay with others temporarily because of lack of shelter availability, and the fear of having children removed from their custody.

Staying with others puts families, infants, and toddlers in vulnerable, harmful situations, and, conditions that may contribute to developmental delays. Parents may stay with abusive/exploitive people, or trade sex in order to have a place to stay.



Homelessness Has Long-Term Consequences

- The high school graduation rate for students experiencing homelessness is 68% compared to 85% for all students.

 This is the lowest graduation rate of any student sub-group, including economically disadvantaged.
- High school students who experience homelessness are 10x more likely to become pregnant or get someone pregnant.
- In addition to the academic impacts, homelessness in the early years can cause developmental delays, social-emotional challenges, and long-term trauma.



Homelessness Creates Barriers to Accessing Early Childhood Programs

- High Mobility of families moving in and out of motels, staying with others, living in cars, etc.
- Lack of documentation and other enrollment barriers, including child immunization and parent work requirements
- Lack of transportation to and from programs

Strategies & Best Practices: Identification

- Ensure all staff know the definition and signs of homelessness
- Create multiple points of identification throughout the year, not just during enrollment
- Remove the word "homeless" from enrollment forms and questionnaires

Strategies & Best Practices: Removing Barriers to Enrollment and Participation

- Ensure families are aware of documentation waivers and extensions.
- Provide or help families access transportation
- Offer **access to basic needs**, like food, clothing, hygiene products, use of washer/dryer, etc.

Ensure all staff are trained to understand the impacts of homelessness on young children

<u>Bulletin 140</u> requires Community Network Lead Agencies to develop a plan and process to coordinate and conduct local observations reliably and without conflict of interest that must be submitted by September 30.

Some important changes have been made to the local observation protocol:

- Guidance on virtual observations and COVID-19 has been removed or limited to the most relevant points for the upcoming school year
- Additional considerations are included for Community Network Lead Agencies who
 observe family child care sites (FCCs) in Academic Approval, including guidance on age
 configuration and observation scheduling
- Lead agencies should stipulate how they will ensure pre-K observers are reliable on the Pre-K-3rd CLASS® 2nd Edition tool

In order to remain in compliance with Bulletin 140, Community Network Lead Agencies should prepare for the 2023-2024 academic year and fall observation period by:

- Collecting information about all publicly-funded classrooms, age configurations, and informational metrics and reporting them in the CLASS® Portal by October 1
- Submitting the Community Network Lead Agency Coordinated Observation Plan and scheduling all observations and planning for shadow scoring, by September 30
- Reaching out to site leaders and FCCs in Academic Approval to prepare them for fall CLASS® Observations as well as the October 1 reporting deadline (for metrics such as teacher certification), by September 15

To prepare for the observation, Community Network Lead Agencies should:

- Ensure observers have certification from Teachstone on file, have an eligible Child Care Criminal Background Check on file with the lead agency, and participate in ongoing calibration and shadow-scoring activities.
- Schedule observers such that observation assignments do not reflect <u>a conflict of</u> interest.
- Remain in contact with FCC educators and observers regarding potential challenges caused by the unique nature of FCC homes and be clear about expectations and support available.



On the day of the observation, observer(s) should:

- Be professional in demeanor and proactive in introducing themselves, verifying classroom information including number of children on the roster, and confirming the daily schedule.
- Confirm classrooms have the regularly-assigned lead teacher, employed for at least 10 work days, as well as 50% of children on the classroom roster present during the observation.
- Follow the recommended procedures for using the CLASS® tool and incorporate guidance from Teachstone on observations in FCC homes.



After observations, Community Network Lead Agencies should ensure that:

- In the unlikely event that observers have any concerns about suspected abuse/neglect, observers must report those concerns immediately.
- CLASS® scores are entered in the portal within ten days of conducting the observation or by the end of the observation period, whichever is first.
- Error corrections and/or Third-Party Appeals are communicated to the Department within thirty days of the observation. Lead agencies should manage appeals of local observations and may choose to take action. Appeals of third-party observations should be submitted to the Department.
- Observers submit their score sheets to the lead agency in a timely manner, and lead agencies retain these score sheets for three years.



There are several requirements in Bulletin 140 that must be carried out by the end of each observation period:

- Community Network Lead Agencies should ensure that all observers have completed one calibration activity during the semester.
- Community Network Lead Agencies should ensure that 10% of all observations during the semester have been shadow-scored, including at least one observation in each age group. By the end of the year, all observers should have been shadow-scored at least once.
- Community Network Lead Agencies should collect certification documents, background checks, and scoring forms (or copies) for all observations and retain them for three years.






Community Network Lead Agencies should begin engagement with program partners ahead of the October 1 deadlines for network meetings, coordinated observation plans, and schedules.


To prepare for accountability during the 2023-2024 school year:

- Collect information required for the accountability participation, including considerations for observing FCCs.
- Ensure the Coordinated Observation Plan reflects feedback from leadership and early childhood program partners.
- Prepare sites for the notifications sent by the Picard Center at the University of Louisiana at Lafayette.




