PROGRAM DESCRIPTION (PURPOSE):

The purpose of the Comprehensive Literacy State Development Grant (CLSD) is to award competitive grants to local education agencies (LEAs) to advance literacy skills, including pre-literacy skills, reading, and writing, for all children from birth through grade 12, with a special emphasis on disadvantaged children, including children living in poverty, English Learners, and children with disabilities.

The allocation is broken down into two separate categories (Birth-5 and K-5) due to grant regulations defining allocation percentages to each grade band.

Focus Area: Opportunity to provide additional and enhanced literacy efforts to build capacity of local leaders, improve practice of teachers, and increase literacy outcomes for children.

BASIS OF ALLOCATION:

Schools with Comprehensive Intervention Required or Urgent Intervention Required - Academics labels are eligible. School systems and lead agencies should prioritize Type III childcare, Head Start/Early Head Start, and/or public and nonpublic pre-K sites that demonstrate high levels of need, ensuring the greatest numbers of disadvantaged, geographically diverse children are being reached.

Parents need to understand and be able to support students in remote learning for students to succeed. Real-time Early Access to Literacy (REAL) provides early literacy support for students in pre-K through grade 5. Through REAL, school systems are allocated funding to provide students in pre-K through grade 5 with tutoring services.

This allocation will provide funding for school systems to offer literacy supports/tutoring to pre-K through fifth-grade students. School systems will receive allocations to fund approved tutoring service providers.

BASIS OF ALLOCATION:

Allocations are based on student populations and school system interest in partnering with an LDOE-approved tutoring provider. Allocations are based on previous year's usage of the program.

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION (PURPOSE):

The purpose of The CHANGE Collective is to improve outcomes for students in schools categorized as persistently struggling. Persistently struggling schools are CIR schools that have earned three or more "F" SPS letter grades in the last five years. During the 2023-2024 school year, six persistently struggling schools across three systems will participate in The CHANGE Collective pilot. Participating systems are Madison Parish, Natchitoches Parish, and St. John the Baptist Parish. Through close collaboration between the LDOE, system, and school leaders, and expert national partners, The CHANGE Collective provides priority support to help schools overcome their most challenging barriers.

BASIS OF ALLOCATION:

This additional is provided to two systems participating in the CHANGE Collective pilot to provide for expenses related to professional development costs that are incurred as a part of the CHANGE Collective pilot schools. These include registration for conferences and travel expenses for CHANGE Collective pilot principals. This allocation is \$17,500 for Madison Parish to cover for three principals, and \$6,000 to St. John the Baptist Parish to cover the cost for one principal.

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION (PURPOSE):

Act 234 of the 2023 Regular Legislative Session requires each elementary, middle, and high school to have an Automated External Defibrillator (AED) on its premises in an easily accessible location. The bill also requires that an AED and a trained AED user who is also trained in first-aid CPR be at each athletic event sponsored by an elementary, middle, or high school. The legislature has appropriated funds for the purchase of AEDs.

BASIS OF ALLOCATION:

The LDOE surveyed all schools to determine which school sites did not have AEDs, as AEDs are required on the premises of all educational institutions and at sponsored athletic events. State-appropriated funds and ESSER III funds are being utilized for allocations at a rate of \$2,500 per AED.

The New Teacher Experience (NTE) is a comprehensive induction program that offers multiple services designed to increase teacher effectiveness, enhance skills, and reduce attrition among beginning teachers. The New Teacher Experience provides both direct supports to teachers and system supports to improve student achievement by improving beginning teacher effectiveness and teacher retention.
