



## Louisiana's Six Critical Goals

- Students enter Kindergarten Ready
- Students will achieve Mastery on third grade assessments and enter fourth grade ready for grade-level content.
- Students will achieve Mastery on eighth grade assessments and enter ninth grade ready for grade-level content.
- Students will graduate on time.
- Students will graduate with a college and/or career credential.
- Students will graduate eligible for a TOPS award.

## Louisiana Pre educator Credential

These credentials signify that an individual has successfully obtained a subset of prerequisite knowledge needed to pursue a postsecondary educational pathway leading to teacher certification in Louisiana. The certificate provides opportunities for entry-level employment as a teacher apprentice in a variety of non-certified educator roles in Louisiana.

## Louisiana Pre educator Credential

#### **Basic:**

1. IBC#573 - Louisiana Pre-Educator Credential

Complete a full <u>LDOE Jumpstart Pre-Educator Pathway</u> AND, one of the following:

- Earn two dual enrollment credits from the required <u>educator pathway</u> <u>course offerings</u>, or
- Earn <u>two-micro-credentials</u>

## Louisiana Pre educator Credential

#### Advanced:


2. IBC# 574 — Louisiana Pre-Educator Credential

To obtain the Louisiana Pre-Educator Credential – Advanced, a student must:

- Complete a full <u>LDOE Jumpstart Pre-Educator Pathway AND</u>,
- Earn at least two dual enrollment credits from the required <u>Pre-Educator</u> <u>Pathway course offerings</u> AND,
- Passing score on the Qualifying <u>ACT/SAT</u> score equivalent (ACT composite score of 22), OR SAT combined verbal and math score of 1100 or higher (New SAT).




## **Student Enrollment Data**

## **Curriculum Access**

The Department has 70 Educator's Rising curriculum licenses to give away to support the growth of the program. If you are interested in receiving a one-year license at no cost, please complete this <u>brief survey</u>.
