

Activity: Sound Manipulation

"Reading Rope" Strand:

Phonological Awareness

Rationale

Phonemes are the most advanced stage in the phonological skills progression. Phonemic awareness includes students being able to manipulate the individual sounds in spoken words and syllables.

Materials: Activity 1: None Activity 2: None

Description of Activities:

Activity 1: Manipulating the beginning sounds in words

- Tell the students a word. Ask the students to change the beginning sound of the word to form a new word.
 - Examples:
 - Say drain. Change /d/ to /b/. brain
 - Say brain. Change /b/ to /k/. crane
 - Say crane. Change /k/ to /g/. grain
 - Say grain. Change /g/ to /t/. train

Activity 2: Manipulating the ending sounds in words

- Tell the students a word. Ask the students to change the final sound of the word to form a new word.
 - Examples:
 - Say shake. Change /k/ to /d/. shade
 - Say shade. Change /d/ to /m/. shame
 - Say shame. Change /m/ to /n/. Shane
 - Say Shane. Change /n/ to /p/. shape
 - Say shape. Change /p/ to /r/. share
 - Say share. Change /r/ to /v/. shave
