What is EveryoneOn?

EveryoneOn is a national nonprofit working to eliminate the digital divide by making high-speed, low-cost Internet service and computers, and free digital literacy courses accessible to all unconnected Americans. They aim to leverage the democratizing power of the Internet to provide opportunity to all Americans – regardless of age, race, geography, income, or education level.

How do I get connected to the Internet via EveryoneOn?

- Go to their website at www.everyoneon.org or text “connect” to 21-545 on your cell phone.
- At the website, type in your zip code and click “Find Offers”.
- You will see a list of low-cost Internet providers in your area.
- Select the company you wish to use and follow the instructions to get signed up.

Are there any restrictions on who can sign up?

Yes. Since this is designed to provide Internet connectivity to those that are struggling to pay for it, there are certain restrictions. They are:

- Low income (at or below \$35,000 annual salary), **or**
- Live in public housing, **or**
- Have at least one child who participates in the National School Lunch Program (NSLP), **or**
- Receive Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits, **or**
- Receive Temporary Assistance for Needy Families Program (TANF) benefits.
- There can be no outstanding balance with the provider or unreturned equipment.
- The household cannot have signed up for internet with the company within the last 90 days.

Who are the providers in Louisiana?

There are four providers available in Louisiana, but not all of these may be available in your area. They are:

- AT&T
- Basic Internet
- Comcast Cable
- Cox Cable

What if I don't have a device (tablet, laptop, etc.) to use? Can I get devices as well?

Yes, the program also provides devices at a discount for those using the Internet service. They are listed on the same page as the Internet service providers after entering your zip code and include a variety of devices at greatly discounted prices. All of the requirements for the Internet program apply to these as well.

Can I get training on how to use the devices and the Internet?

Yes, at the bottom of the results page, are a list of training locations near you that provide free training on how to use a computer and the Internet. Contact them at the number listed for more information and a schedule of their classes.
