Any current Louisiana educator is eligible; you do not need to be a school-site Teacher Leader to apply. We need educators who are passionate about ensuring that high-quality materials are available to Louisiana students and have

- a desire for growth opportunities,
- · deep understanding of content standards, and
- the capacity to devote time towards additional projects outside the normal work day.

There is a specific need for expert educators in the areas of early literacy, intervention specialist, Early Childhood (Birth to 3 and pre-K), and K-12 science and social studies (elementary and/or world history experience and expertise). We also need K-12 teachers across ELA and math content areas. Special education teachers who specialize in these areas are also encouraged to apply.
