ASVAB Career Exploration Program

The Department of Defense introduced the ASVAB (which stands for Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery) in 1968. It was originally designed to predict future academic and occupational success in military occupations. However, extensive research indicates the ASVAB assesses academic ability and predicts success in a wide variety of occupations.

ASVAB CEP is designed to help young people explore their options and make a plan. The ASVAB CEP is used for career exploration and is offered **free** to participating high schools and early post-secondary students.

Middle School News

Middle School College and Career Exploration

Please share with middle and high school counselors and administrators.

The focus of career and college exploration has primarily been for high school students. However, when these conversations start prior to entering high school, students have a jump start on making the right decisions about their post secondary plans. These conversations should include the process of starting Individual Graduation Plans.

Individual Graduation Plans should be initiated in middle school. A quality Individual Graduation Plan (IGP) is crucial for student success. As stated in the High School Planning Guidebook, per BESE Bulletin 741, "by the end of the eighth grade, each student shall begin to develop, with the input of his parent(s) or other legal custodians and school counselor, an individual graduation plan." Students, along with their school counselors and families, should review, update and sign the IGP yearly until graduation. High school counselors should collaborate with feeder middle school counselors to ensure this process begins prior to students entering high school.

State Seal of Biliteracy

Since the approval of RS 17:273.4 in 2024, Louisiana students may earn the State Seal of Biliteracy by demonstrating literacy in English and another language. Along with the <u>Diploma Order Form</u>, school systems should submit the <u>Seals of Biliteracy Reguest Document</u>.

High schools with at least 5% of their graduating class earning the Seal of Biliteracy will be celebrated at the **June BESE meeting**.

Proficiency by Exam/Portfolio

Bulletin 741 §2314. Carnegie Credit and Credit Flexibility contains a policy concerning student's earning proficiency credit by exam or portfolio.

- Per policy, school systems must report exams/portfolios used to award credit by proficiency
- Students may only earn credit by exam or portfolio in a course in which they have never been enrolled and received no formal instruction

Q: Is there a new rule for students and FAFSA?

- The "Curious" Counselor

A: The <u>linked memorandum</u> outlines the updated FAFSA policy for next school year. During its March 2024 meeting, BESE approved a repeal of the policy requiring graduating seniors to complete steps related to the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) applications. This policy change will be effective starting with the graduation cohort of 2024-2025 and does not remove the requirement of local education agencies (LEAs) to provide students and their parents or guardians with information regarding financial aid programs to support postsecondary education and training. LEAs must ensure that each student receives adequate support in completing and submitting an application for financial aid. However, a student action related to FAFSA completion will not be required. An updated parent and student financial aid planning toolkit will be made available to school systems. Please contact <u>ldefinancialaid@la.gov</u> with questions.
