#### LOSFA: 2025-2026 FAFSA

The 2025-2026 FAFSA opened on December 1. The 2025-2026 FAFSA form is for students attending college in the fall of 2025, including 2025 high school graduates. Students are encouraged to create their FSA ID before beginning their FAFSA application.

### 2025 Future Law Enforcement Youth Academy (FLEYA)

FBI New Orleans, Tulane University Police Department, and the Louisiana Chapter of the FBI National Academy are proud to announce the introduction of the 2025 Future Law Enforcement Youth Academy (FLEYA) to Louisiana. Two of the nation's most notable and iconic institutions will conduct law enforcement and legal training for selected youth from Louisiana.

The FLEYA training program will be a FREE weeklong overnight camp exposing students (15 to 17 years of age) to federal, state, and local law enforcement practices. This joint effort promotes law enforcement career paths by giving the selected youths an inside look at the various procedures and techniques taught by subject matter experts and agency instructors. Tulane's Uptown campus will serve as the home base for an academic environment with the premier atmosphere to encourage students to pursue higher education and careers in law enforcement.



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#### **FLEYA Eligibility Criteria**

- United States citizen residing in the state of Louisiana
- Currently enrolled in a Louisiana High School
- 15 to 17 years old at the time of FLEYA, which will be held June 1-6
- Minimum GPA of 2.7
- Must be present each day of the FLEYA program

A <u>completed application</u> and essay must be submitted in PDF form to <u>LouisianaFLEYA@fbi.gov</u>. No Google Docs or applications requiring a password to access will be accepted. This program is only for current high school students. Students graduating from high school in the spring of 2025 are not eligible.

### Middle School News

#### Middle School Career Development

Please share with administrators and school counselors.

Career development starts at a young age and grows as students learn more about their interests. As students grow and explore the world around them, they are exposed to various career paths. Middle school is a time when students can participate in lessons and activities that further expose them to the career development process. Lessons and activities should be interesting and engaging while still being informative.

Activities that can actively engage students to think about post-secondary career and educational options include college and career fairs and industry partner visits. Recent graduates from feeder high schools can talk to students about their experiences in college and/or the careers they are pursuing. This allows middle school students to interact with adults closer to their age. Students who have graduated from high school with career certifications can also discuss the benefits of taking courses in high school that have assisted with their career goals. During industry partner visits, students can have small group discussions with professionals where they can ask more detailed questions, as opposed to general information that may come from a large group presentation. Middle school students may be more apt to ask questions and participate in discussions when in smaller settings.

### **Counselor Rubric and Evaluation Process**

#### **LEADS Evaluation Process for Counselors**

Please share with administrators and school counselors.

The LEADS evaluation process includes a <u>Beginning-of-Year (BOY) Conference</u>, <u>Middle-of-Year (MOY) Conference</u>, and <u>End-of-Year (EOY) Conference</u>. The BOY allows for the counselor and evaluator to



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set goals and an action plan collaboratively. Between the BOY and EOY, the evaluator will collect evidence aligned with the <u>Louisiana Counselor Rubric</u>. During the MOY, the counselor will reflect on progress towards goals, and the evaluator will provide feedback. Feedback includes an area of reinforcement (relative strength) and an area of refinement (relative area of improvement). ## Industry Based Certification Basic Bundles

The Louisiana Workforce Commission's Workforce Investment Council approved the first set of Basic Bundles to the state focus list. A Basic Bundle is a set of stackable credentials, where each earned credential adds value to a student's qualifications, enhancing their competitiveness in the job market. While individual credentials may have limited value on their own, achieving a bundle of industry-validated credentials demonstrates that a student possesses a comprehensive set of technical skills that are highly valued by employers. The initial set of basic bundles includes:

#### Bundle 1

- Forklift Operator (with hands-on training)
- 2. NCCER Basic Rigger
- 3. NCCER Signal Person
- 4. NCCER Level 1 (any craft area)

#### Bundle 2

- 1. Certified Nurse Assistant
- 2. Certified Phlebotomy Technician
- 3. EKG Technician

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#### Bundle 3

- 1. Emergency Medical Responder
- 2. IFSAC Firefighter

#### Bundle 4

- 1. Fundamentals of JavaScript, Functional Programming and Web Development Level 1
- 2. PYTHON Certification

#### Bundle 5

- 1. American Welding Society 3G and 3F (plate or pipe)
- 2. American Welding Society 4G and 4F (plate or pipe)

**A:** For the 2024-2025 school year, systems may choose to continue the Legacy (COMPASS) evaluation process or transition to the <u>LEADS</u> evaluation process. Full implementation for all systems will take place in 2025-2026. LEADS evaluations for counselors include the <u>Louisiana Counselor Rubric</u> for the qualitative portion of evaluation.
