2023-2024 Academic Recovery and Acceleration Plans

On August 1 the LDOE will launch <u>Louisiana Comeback 3.0</u>, a statewide campaign to continue planning for and investing in the improvements Louisiana students need and deserve. New Teacher Experience: Professional Learning Modules

The Department developed <u>Professional Learning Modules</u> on topics that are critical for new teacher success. These modules, designed to build learning throughout the year, include online asynchronous content followed by an in-person learning lab where participants practice and apply these concepts.

- Module 1: Classroom Management/Classroom Environment
- Module 2: Standards and Curriculum
- Module 3: Data Literacy
- Module 4: Literacy for 21st Century Learners
- Module 5: Parent and Community Engagement

Teachers are expected to complete the entire series of Professional Learning Modules. After completing registration, participants will receive details on selected training locations. This learning opportunity is provided at no cost to systems; however, any travel costs must be covered by the school systems. Registration will close August 12 or once capacity is reached. 2023-2024 Mentor Waiver Application

BESE approved a waiver for the Mentor policy for the 2023-2024 school year at its April meeting. Mentor teacher waivers will be granted on a case-by-case basis through the application process established by the LDOE and at no fee to the applicant, school system, or teacher preparation provider.

The <u>2023-2024 Mentor Waiver application</u> is now open and must be created by the system leader responsible for resident placement and/or Mentor recruitment and support. We encourage system leaders leading this work to review the <u>Mentor Credential Waiver Application guide</u> for waiver qualifications before applying.
