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# **Message from the Superintendent**

Dear Colleagues,

I'm excited to announce that, effective immediately, we are reducing the time students spend taking state assessments by 20%. You can <u>learn more on our website</u>. This initial reduction is focused on grades 3-8 ELA and math LEAP tests, and marks the first action in a long-term commitment for future reductions.

As I have shared with legislators, the state board, and our education community, we must be thoughtful about the amount of time students spend testing. These assessments are invaluable tools that help us identify student progress and target support. We must strike a strategic balance with implementation to decrease the time students are sitting for tests.

We're taking a responsible approach to surgically reduce standardized testing time without affecting accuracy. I hear constantly from parents, teachers, and students about this issue. These changes address their concerns, while allowing us to still have reliable and valid results.

## **Leader Mentors Needed**

The LDOE is seeking effective school leaders to serve as mentors for the next generation of school leaders. Interested current school leaders will receive professional development focused on supporting and coaching future school leaders.

Multiple mentoring opportunities are available. Mentoring opportunities can last between three and twelve months. The LDOE will schedule some meetings, but mentors will schedule the majority at their convenience, which can occur virtually or in person.

Research has consistently demonstrated that mentoring future school leaders is critical for their long term retention and success. Therefore, mentoring is being added for new principals and will be a core component of the new alternative pathway into principalship recently approved by BESE (EDL Alternate Pathway 4). #### See the Sound-Visual Phonics Training Opportunity

Please share with special education leaders, teachers of deaf and hard of hearing, special education teachers, speech-language pathologists, and teachers of English learners.

The LDOE will be sponsoring a two-day training on See the Sound-Visual Phonics. Participants are required to attend and participate in both days to be officially trained to use this multisensory instructional tool that includes a system of unique hand movements and written symbols that are associated with the production of each sound. This research-based strategy can be used in conjunction with high-quality core instructional materials and is often used to support/supplement explicit reading instruction. Visual Phonics has proven successful with all students and has been the key to connecting sounds with the letters they represent for students working to master phonological awareness skills, English learners, early childhood classes, and as a quick whole group activity in kindergarten and first grade.
