#### Eligibility criteria:

#### **Financial Aid Planning**

The U.S. Department of Education has revamped the FAFSA application. The 2025-2026 application will open on or before December 1. Students and families should begin creating and/ or resetting usernames and passwords (FSA IDs) well in advance of the opening date.

- Fill out the <u>2025-2026 FAFSA</u> application (if you want to apply for the federal Pell grant, federal student loans, the Louisiana GO Grant, and TOPS.)
- Fill out a <u>TOPS application</u> on the LOSFA website (if you want TOPS only).
