<u>Bulletin 741</u> requires that all students must take the LEAP 2025 for all assessment-eligible courses (English I, English II, Algebra I, Geometry, Biology, Civics, U.S. History.)

The bulletin also requires all students take and pass 1 course in each of three subject pairs.

- All students: Algebra I or Geometry
- All students: English I or English II

For students entering high school before 2024-2025

• All students: **U.S. History** or Biology

For students entering high school during or after 2024-2025

• All students: **Civics** or Biology

The U.S. Department of Education has revamped the FAFSA application. The 2025-2026 application will open on or before December 1, 2024.

Students and families should begin creating and/ or resetting username and passwords (FSA IDs) well in advance of the opening date.

The <u>2025-2026 FAFSA</u> application (if you want to apply for the federal Pell grant, federal student loans, the Louisiana GO Grant, and TOPS).

A <u>TOPS application</u> is on the LOSFA website (if you want TOPS only).

Please consult the following chart when determining if a student is included in your graduation cohort:

Graduation Cohort Inclusion?	What dates are used?
Student is a member of the district graduation cohort	The student was enrolled on October 1 of the third and fourth year of high school. Does not have to be the same school.
Student is a member of the school cohort	Student is a member of the district cohort <u>and</u> is enrolled at this site on February 1 of fourth year.
Dropouts	Dropouts count at the last school of record regardless of any October enrollment.

Q: Where can I find information about the new Louisiana Accountability System? Does any of it affect counselors?



- The "Accountable" Counselor

A: <u>Grow.Achieve.Thrive.</u> is Louisiana's revised K-12 accountability system. The plan's name comes from its three core student expectations. Louisiana expects all students to grow academically year-over year, achieve proficiency on key content, and thrive beyond high school.

Thrive is the component that closely aligns to the work of the school counselor. High schools will

be measured on the number of students graduating on time and students showing readiness on a nationally recognized exam. Students can accelerate through a university, career, or service accelerator. The acceleration choice is not dependent on the graduation pathway.

Feel free to review the <u>August 30 Counselor webinar</u> for additional information. The LDOE is in the process of compiling chat questions from all of the Accountability webinars. The approved FAQ is scheduled to be uploaded to the Accountability website later this month. This document should assist in a better understanding of Grow.Achieve.Thrive.
