My name is Claire Meche, and I currently serve as the K-12 social studies content leader for the Acadia Parish School Board. This is my 18th year as a social studies educator and my first year as a <u>Teacher Leader Advisor (TLA)</u>.

Collaborating with my fellow TLAs as we create the social studies course frameworks aligned to the 2022 Louisiana Student Standards for Social Studies has been incredibly rewarding. Together, we have created course frameworks designed to support teachers in implementing the 2022 LSSSS by scoping and sequencing content standards over the course of the year. Topics and units are planned around openended framing questions that ask students to *think deeply and critically* about the content and move beyond simple recall instruction in social studies to *making and expressing claims* based on evidence. The <u>new course frameworks</u> are a more accessible and user-friendly way for teachers to prepare and teach aligned lessons.

Students will also have an improved learning experience with the new course frameworks, as they will have access to resources for setting the context and developing background knowledge, exploring primary and secondary sources, and developing and expressing claims.

By contributing to the course frameworks, I have been able to make a significant difference in the quality of <u>social</u> <u>studies</u> education in Louisiana, and I am excited to see how these new resources will impact social studies classrooms in Louisiana. Teachers of all content areas can appreciate the excitement and enthusiasm that comes along with building better resources to improve our students' educational experience. The Department will continue to offer webinars and guidance on the new course frameworks throughout the 2023-204 school year.

<u>Teacher Leader Summit</u> is just around the corner and I hope to see you there! Social studies sessions will cover unit and lesson planning using the new course frameworks, exploring new Louisiana History resources, the design principles and key features of the Bayou Bridges: a K-8 Social Studies curriculum, and finally information on the new social studies assessment and resources available to support students. Teacher Leader Summit will have an abundance of sessions on a variety of topics, and I'm sure you will find sessions that support your own professional development.

ELA Guidebooks Text Updates

The Department made minor updates to two ELA Guidebooks 3-5 (2022) units for Grade 3, The Stories Julian Tells and Cajun Folktales. The Stories Julian Tells unit has a new edition of the anchor text, *The Stories Julian Tells* by Ann Cameron (©2023), and the updated version of the text is now available in the <u>American Reading Company</u> portal. This text change affects section 3, lessons 1 and 2, and the teaching guide will be updated to align with each version of the text. In addition, "Animal Traits and Features" has replaced the text in section 7 of the Cajun Folktales unit, "Animal Facts."

Additionally, due to shifts in text permissions, some texts in additional ELA Guidebooks units will no longer be accessible in the XanEdu Unit Readers. Educators should review the ELA Guidebooks Licensing Updates document for an overview of the affected units and updates to text access for each impacted unit. As the Department works with XanEdu to secure access to each text, the document will be updated with additional details.

CIS Evaluation Closeout for Teachers, Counselors, and Librarians

Teachers, counselors, and librarians are encouraged to review and sign off on all observation and Student Learning Target (SLT) data prior to leaving for summer break. Once the Compass Information System (CIS) transfers to the new school year in the fall, no teacher, counselor, or librarian evaluation data for the 2022-2023 school year can be added or amended. To create a streamlined process, it is recommended that educators complete the following tasks:

- Enter all SLTs in CIS
- Assess students and <u>report SLT</u> results in <u>CIS</u>
- Meet with evaluators to view and acknowledge observation and SLT scores

In April 2021, BESE approved changes to Bulletin 746 regarding mentor credential requirements. These updates include honoring previous training and experience including

- EDL or previous administrative certifications
- NIET trained evaluators
- CLASS trained evaluators
- Supervision of Student Teachers

Teachers may already qualify for the Mentor credential. Teachers who meet one of the previous training experiences listed above can apply through the certification portal for the Mentor credential.

Teachers selected to serve as Mentors to residents (undergraduate and post-baccalaureate) receive \$2,000 for their work.
