Hello Teacher Leaders! I am Danielle Johnson, newly appointed assistant principal at ReNEW Schaumburg Elementary in New Orleans and former kindergarten teacher. I am excited to share that the Louisiana Department of Education has collaborated with educators who have extensive experience with the Louisiana Student Standards for Math to develop a resource to support K-5 math teachers in building students' foundational math skills. This new resource, Foundational Lessons for Accelerating Math Education (FLAME), is coming to you this fall! FLAME will be similar to its literacy counterpart, FIRE. It will provide activities designed to build grade-level foundations alongside high-quality resources, formative tools for teachers to understand students' learning, and tools to communicate with parents. FLAME resources will post to the Math Refresh page in September.

One of the main priorities of all teachers is ensuring their students' progress toward *mastery* of their grade-level content. The most frequent question I hear from teachers is, "They didn't get it...what should I do next?" While I applaud my colleagues for taking responsibility for ensuring their students' learning needs are met, I know that many teachers are at a loss for what to do next. **FLAME remedies the daunting uncertainty around the next steps.** The mini-lessons in this resource will support students in solidifying math foundational skills. What makes FLAME unique is that, in addition to providing *standard-aligned activities*, each lesson will include *assessment items* and *actionable next steps*. Through FLAME, teachers can also access tools to communicate with parents about students' foundational skills. This resource will allow you to meet your students with varying needs right where they are. Be on the lookout this fall for FLAME!

As our students return to the classroom for the new school year, all educators must be prepared to meet their students' needs. Regardless of the subject you teach, we are all passionate about supporting our students in their pursuit of academic success!

Literacy Screener Support

The K-3 Literacy Screener consists of a set of measures for assessing reading skills. This universal screening identifies which students may be at risk for experiencing reading difficulties. Teachers use this data to set and monitor literacy goals, as well as provide instructional support.

SUPPORT FOR DIVERSE LEARNERS

Literacy Alternate Assessment Rubric (LAAR)

This Literacy Alternate Assessment Rubric (LAAR) is the alternate assessment to the K-3 Literacy Screener, DIBELS® 8th Edition, for students with significant cognitive disabilities in grades K-3. Only students that the IEP team has used the K-2 Alternate Assessment Decision Making Tool or the 3-11 Alternate Assessment Criteria to determine eligibility should be scored on the literacy screener using the LAAR. Literacy screener and the <u>LAAR</u> resources are located in the <u>Literacy Screener Library</u>.
