Supporting Program Development through Believe and Prepare: Early Childhood

Early Childhood Ancillary Teaching Certificate

Louisiana will support qualified teachers to meet policy requirements, while also increasing the number of high-quality preparation programs around the state.

Develop EC Ancillary Certificate Programs that provide high-quality CDA coursework	Support current teacher to receive the EC Ancillary Teaching Certificate
1. Support the development of BESE- approved Early Childhood Ancillary Certificate Programs through Believe and Prepare: Early Childhood	 Encourage currently qualified teachers to obtain the EC Ancillary Certificate prior to 2019
2. Increase the number and geographic reach of BESE-approved programs to be available for all teachers-in-training	2. Provide scholarships and support the completion of qualifying credentials/coursework prior to 2019

Believe and Prepare: Early Childhood Preparing Louisiana's Child Care Lead Teachers

The Believe and Prepare: Early Childhood grant is supporting teacher preparation programs to design high-quality training for child care lead teachers.

Believe and Prepare: Early Childhood

- Competitive grant opportunity to support teacher preparation programs that are seeking BESE-approval to offer an *Early Childhood Ancillary Certificate Program*
- Believe and Prepare: Early Childhood programs receive:
 - 1. Funding to supports costs of program design and start up
 - 2. Technical Assistance from the Department to assist with program design
- Programs work to design coursework and practice experiences that are aligned to CLASSTM

Through Believe and Prepare: Early Childhood, the Department will continue to expand the number of Early Childhood Ancillary Certificate Programs.

Believe and Prepare: Early Childhood Progress to Date

Two cohorts of Believe and Prepare: Early Childhood have received BESE-approval to offer Early Childhood Ancillary Certificate Programs.

- Early Childhood Cohort 1 (Winter 2015-Winter 2016)
 - Four programs received approval from BESE and have offered coursework for the 2016-2017 year:
 - NSU, Children's Coalition, Agenda for Children, Volunteers of America
- Early Childhood Cohort 2 (Fall 2016-Fall 2017)
 - Seven programs received approval from BESE and will offer coursework this year:
 - BRCC, On Track by 5, Center for Development and Learning, Jefferson Parish, Children First, LSU-A, LSU-E

The Department will be releasing a Request for Applications for Believe and Prepare: Early Childhood Cohort 3 later this month.

Early Childhood Teacher Preparation Requirements

Support All Teachers To Be Excellent Addressing Differences in Supports for Teachers

Challenge: Teachers do not have equitable access to professional preparation and training across program types.

Teachers are the most critical factor in achieving high-quality outcomes for children.

Louisiana should unify and strengthen systems so children have access to teachers who:

1. Are Prepared

- Have education and experience needed to teach young children
- 2. Are Professional Educators
 - Have time and support to set goals, plan daily activities and instruction, and adjust teaching based on ongoing assessment of children's progress
- 3. Are Continually Improving
 - Receive ongoing feedback and coaching on interactions and instruction
- 4. Are Rewarded for Quality Teaching

Early Childhood Teacher Policies

Unified expectations for teacher credentials will professionalize the workforce, and ensure teachers refine their skills at quality teacher preparation programs.

- 1. Maintain BA Degree AND teaching certificate requirement for teachers in public and nonpublic pre-K for four-year-olds
- 2. Establish the Early Childhood Ancillary Certificate as a expectation for child care lead teachers by 2019
 - Currently, teachers can receive the certificate by presenting any qualifying credential
 - Through Believe and Prepare: Early Childhood, Louisiana is developing of Early Childhood Ancillary Certificate Programs that will offer specialized child care teacher coursework
- 3. Create specialized Birth to Kindergarten BA field of study and teaching certificate
 - Courses align with Ancillary Teaching Certificate so teachers can stack courses
- 4. Support teachers to pursue credentials and reward performance
 - Increase scholarship program and link credentials to School Readiness Tax Credits

EC Ancillary Certificate required for all **lead teachers** in Type III centers by 2019.

Early Childhood Ancillary Teaching Certificate Qualifying Certificates

There are multiple ways to qualify for an Early Childhood Ancillary Certificate.

- 1. Child Development Associate (CDA) awarded by the Council for Professional Recognition and a high school diploma or equivalent
- 2. A technical diploma or certificate of technical studies in an early childhood related field from an accredited technical or community college
- **3.** An early childhood career diploma that has been approved by the Louisiana Pathways Career Development System
- 4. An associate degree in an early childhood related field from a regionally accredited college or university
- 5. A bachelor degree or higher from a regionally accredited college or university

Early Childhood Ancillary Teaching Certificate How to Apply

Qualified teachers complete Ancillary Certificate application packet and submit documentation to LDE. No fees will be charged.



*BESE-approved programs offer coursework for the CDA and technical diploma credentials

Developing Early Childhood Ancillary Certificate Programs

Louisiana must expand the number of BESE-approved Early Childhood Ancillary Certificate Programs to ensure all teachers can access high-quality training.

Early Childhood Ancillary Certificate Programs:

- Provide high-quality CDA qualifying coursework that includes integrated applied practice and extensive teacher development
- Receive a formal review by BESE to evaluate the quality and coherence across programs
- Qualifying teachers receive a tuition scholarship through LA Pathways

Proposed Policy Revision:

- Later this month, BESE will consider the following proposal:
 - 1. Beginning in July 2018, lead teachers with 36 hours or less of CDA hours completed will be expected to attend a BESE-approved Early Childhood Ancillary Certificate Program
 - 2. Teachers will be able to submit an appeal to attend other training programs if they cannot access a Early Childhood Ancillary Certificate Program
 - 3. Lead teachers with more than 36 hours of training may complete their CDA at any location
