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TOPS University Updates

BESE approved the inclusion of African-American studies to the matrix previously approved by BESE/BOR for the purpose of eligibility requirements for an Opportunity, Performance, or Honors Award beginning with graduates during or after the 2021-2022 school year. The inclusion of African-American studies will fulfill the TOPS University requirement of four units of social studies.

Dual Enrollment Policy Update

The Board of Regents extended the <u>Interim Dual Enrollment Admissions policy</u> for the 2021-22 and 2022-23 academic years. Under the emergency policy, which was passed last year by the Board of Regents in response to the Covid-19 pandemic, students who wish to enroll in dual enrollment classes may enroll if they meet the following criteria:

- A minimum 2.5 cumulative high school GPA, as determined by the high school and subject-specific demonstration of readiness in Mathematics (for mathematics and science courses) or English (for English, foreign language, history, social science, humanities, or arts survey courses) through either: Subject-specific minimum scores on any assessment listed in Academic Affairs Policy 2.22 (see table page 2) OR;
- Counselor recommendation based on overall student performance and grade trends in the subject

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Community Service Diploma Endorsement

School systems may award a Community Service Diploma Endorsement to freshmen entering high school in the 2013-2014 school year and beyond completing a total of 80 hours of community service in ninth through twelfth grade providing opportunities to apply academic learning to real life events.

Students may earn service hours identified in the Community Service Diploma Endorsement Categories. The Community Service Opportunities document lists ways to earn service hours while maintaining safety measures.

Who	Action Step
Student	Completes service hours and documents efforts on the Community Service Endorsement Documentation Form.
School	Uses the <u>Community Service Diploma Endorsement Tracking Form</u> to summarize the student efforts. Documentation is housed at the local level.
School	Uses code "C1" in STS to document the student has met the Community Service Endorsement requirement.
School	Orders the Community Service Seals yearly using the electronic Diploma Order Form shared via the Department Newsletter. Orders should align with the number earned by students shown in STS.

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2022-2023 FAFSA Kick-Off

The <u>Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)</u> opened on October 1. Completing the application early is imperative to ensure students get the maximum aid available to them. Schools/school systems can get live, phone or online assistance with FAFSA completion events from the Department. FAFSA completion or having a waiver on file is a requirement for graduation. Students who are not in compliance are not counted in the graduation cohort.

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College Credit Goals and Recommendations

The **Board of Regents and Board of Elementary and Secondary Education** have a joint goal that beginning with the freshman class of 2025 all Louisiana public high school graduates will complete high school with college credit (academic and/or career-technical), a postsecondary credential of value or both.

The **Dual Enrollment Task Force** recommended each high school student have the opportunity to enroll in at least four dual enrollment courses before graduation, and that the accountability system provide corresponding incentives that reflect the need for career and college readiness.

The **Louisiana Legislature** stressed through ACT 204 of the 2020 Regular Legislative Session that "the availability of dual enrollment, Advanced Placement, International Baccalaureate courses, or any combination thereof, in core academic areas in all high schools is critical."

Dual Diploma Attainment

Associate degree opportunities for high school students have been underutilized in Louisiana. While the number of school systems offering an associate's degree program in high school has increased, the number of students taking advantage of this opportunity remains small. Graduation cohort data from 2019 shows that only 159 out of 42,650 graduates earned both a high school diploma and an associate degree upon graduation from high school.

With the appropriate collaboration, structures, incentives and frameworks in place, we believe there is room to increase this opportunity for all Louisiana students.

Fast Forward Overview

<u>Fast Forward</u> is a program which will allow students to earn either a Jump Start TOPS Tech Career Diploma or a TOPS University Diploma while dually earning an associate degree or participating in a Louisiana Workforce Commission recognized <u>pre-apprenticeship</u> or <u>apprenticeship</u> that either prepares graduates for career or continuing postsecondary education.

In this program, students spend the majority of grades 9 and 10 on the high school campus earning core graduation requirements. In grades 11 and 12 they spend the majority of time on the postsecondary campus or postsecondary accredited site on a high school campus dually enrolled in courses to complete graduation requirements as well as earning an associate degree or participating in a pre-apprenticeship or apprenticeship opportunity.

Planning Grants

Grants funded by the Louisiana Department of Education and Board of Regents were awarded in each Regional Labor Market Area (RLMA) to kick start this initiative. Lead school systems met with other interested school systems, economic development organizations, business and industry partners and postsecondary institutions in the region to develop pathway frameworks approved by BESE in June. 39 pathways were developed in the 8 RLMAs based on future job forecasting for each region. These pathways are approved for statewide use with the approved postsecondary and apprenticeship organizations.



GENERATE MONITOR ID

An email has been sent to containing the information you need to allow students to register themselves with permissions for you to monitor their progress.

The capability to monitor students is intended to provide parents, friends, recruiters and educators the ability to follow-up with their students and help keep them on target, or to provide a material review or extra credit assignments. It is NOT intended to be used by teachers as a replacement for other lesson plans, or as a required grade. Any violation of the use of the monitoring module may result in your account being deactivated.

There are no restrictions on the use of the SAT/ACT materials.

There are 2 ways for a student to add a monitor:

- •Register using the link provided in the email
- •Register normally, then add the monitor using the Monitor ID and Last Name provided in the email.

When you click the Generate Monitor ID link, the system processes and confirms the request. An email is sent to your registered email address with the information to allow students to add you as their monitor.
