LDOE & NIET Partnership

As a result of the RFP process, the Louisiana Department of Education (LDOE) contracted with the National Institute for Excellence in Teaching (NIET) to assist with reimagining the Louisiana evaluation system.

Key improvements developed through this partnership include:

- Evidence-based practices that enhance teaching and leadership;
- A more **fair and transparent** process that includes multiple measures, supports self reflection, and gives teachers a voice;
- Better feedback for improvement and resources to support individual growth;
 and
- Stronger connections between evaluation and professional learning.





Comprehensive Training for Evaluators

First-time evaluators will attend a face-to-face training.

• Louisiana Aspiring Educator Evaluation training is a two-day training with a 3rd asynchronous session to prepare for certification.

The evaluator certification process includes a passing score on an assessment to ensure inter-rater reliability and accuracy of ratings.

• Evaluators must renew certification annually, per Bulletin 130.




Louisiana Aspiring Educator Evaluation System

- Louisiana Aspiring Educator Rubric (LAER): Helps build a common language among EPPs, and is correlated with student achievement and growth
- Training and Certification: A process that leads to more fair and reliable educator evaluations by certified observers
- Formal Observations: Each observation is followed by a post-observation where teachers are supported in reflecting on the lesson
- Professionalism: Allows for the assessment and acknowledgement of aspiring educator growth and reflection, community involvement, and school responsibilities

Phase 1 of New System

The Teacher Certification Online portal, question and application system is being redesigned in phases.

- Phase 1-Question System revamped
 - Testing occurred June 17 through July 19
 - Full implementation tentatively set for sometime in **August**
 - Users will need:
 - MyLa account
 - EdLink Security access (HR/Prep user roles only)
 - Access to the Teacher Certification ZenDesk Help Center

Application Submission Deadline

To be eligible for associated funding and stipends, **resident teacher**, **practitioner teacher**, **and mentor teacher** certifications must be issued by **October 1**.

- Applications must be submitted by September 1
- Applications prioritized in September
- Applies to Mentor Teacher Waiver

Add-On Endorsements Coursework Collection

The Certification Team will be collecting coursework for Add-On Endorsements from all university partners. First, a **pilot of the survey** will be open starting **today**, **July 31st.**

- Open on August 19th
- Due on September 16th

Certification Reminders



New Applications

- All applications are required to be the June 1, 2024 version for processing.
- Any applications not on this version will be 'kicked back' unprocessed.



Out of Field Praxis Support

- LDOE is <u>making funding available</u> to reduce barriers for certified teachers teaching out of their field. LDOE will be covering:
 - Praxis exam costs
 - Certification costs (if exams completed by August 16)
- Progress so far:
 - 76 Educators approved
 - 110 Praxis Content Exams vouchers approved
- Applications are still open, and educators should complete the survey by August 2.

New EDL 1 Alternate Pathway 4: MPA, MBA, JD and US Military Officers

- Available to those who have been awarded a Master of Public Administration,
 Master of Business Administration, Juris Doctorate, or honorably discharged
 commissioned officer of the United States military with a pay grade of O3 or higher.
- Successful completion of the BESE-approved <u>School Leaders Licensure</u> <u>Assessment (SLLA)</u>
- Completion of the educational leader training coordinated by LDOE.
- Anyone who qualifies <u>must complete an application</u> to attend the required LDOE sponsored boot camp.
- Additionally, the LDOE is in need of mentors to support these new educational leaders. Prospective mentors <u>must complete an application</u> as well.

Literacy Coursework Requirements (Initial)

Candidates completing Louisiana teacher preparation programs on or after **September 1, 2024**, are required to have completed literacy coursework semester hours or equivalent contact hours for **initial certification**.

- 3 semester hours for Secondary or All-level general education areas
- 6 semester hours for Middle School 4-8 general education areas
- 9 semester hours for Birth to Kindergarten, PreK-3rd Grade, Elementary 1-5, and *all* Special Education areas, including integrated-to-merged Mild/Moderate programs
- A Teaching of Reading exam CANNOT be accepted in place of literacy coursework for initial certification candidates completing after 9/1/2024

Sample Look-Fors in Literacy Coursework Review

For instance, if your program is approved for the following pathways, during the review, they will be checking for:

- Elementary, Gr. 1-5: (checking to see if all literacy courses under this pathway meet the science of reading competencies and includes the 9 credit hours required for this certification area)
- ELA, Gr. 4-8: (checking to see if all literacy courses under this pathway meet the science of reading competencies and includes the 6 credit hours required for this certification area)
- English, Gr. 6-12: (checking to see if all literacy courses under this pathway meet the science of reading competencies and includes the 3 credit hours required for this certification area)
- SpEd M/M, Grs. 1-5 and 6-12: (checking to see if all literacy courses under this pathway meet
 the science of reading competencies and includes the 9 credit hours required for this
 certification area)

Dyslexia Course Requirements

According to <u>Bulletin 996</u>, all Dyslexia coursework should begin this coming school year.

 Beginning with the 2024-2025 school year, for all certification areas, candidates must spend three credit hours within the existing credit hour requirements engaged in coursework regarding teaching students with dyslexia.

Bulletin 746 states when certification will be looking for the requirements.

Beginning September 1, 2028, literacy requirements include a minimum of three credit hours or contact hour equivalent regarding teaching students with dyslexia.

Sample Look-Fors in Dyslexia Coursework Review

When reviewing course descriptions for the dyslexia requirement, reviewers are looking for two things:

- 3 credit hours towards a course engaged in teaching students with dyslexia (this can be embedded in an existing literacy course that address SoR and dyslexia or it can be a stand alone course)
- Does the course meet the dyslexia competencies



Literacy Exam Requirements

Beginning **January 1, 2024**, **Out-of-State** applicants authorized to teach grades K-3 and Special education areas, not meeting exam requirements with experience will need to take the Teaching of Reading exam **in addition** to content and pedagogy exams.

Initial applicants completing **in-state** preparation programs already enrolled in the year-long residency and holding either the PL or R credential prior to **January 1, 2025**, are not subject to taking the Teaching of Reading exam.

Add-on policy is effective **September 1, 2024**.

New Literacy Exam Option

BESE adopted the Louisiana Elementary Multiple-Subjects exam (7001), which includes the Teaching of Reading exam, as a part of the English Language Arts subtest.

- Allows for an option with the same number of exams as currently required
- Includes grades K-3 (PK-3, 1-5, Special Education areas)
- Passing score increases over time to gradually increase Science of Reading skill mastery for teacher candidates



Add-on Literacy Requirements (General)

For add-on purposes, general reading and literacy hours may be fulfilled with:

- The indicated semester hours
 - Successful completion of the BESE-approved <u>literacy foundations</u> <u>training</u> *may* be accepted for the number of hours approved per program documented with completion certificate
- Equivalent contact hours or
- Passing the adopted Teaching of Reading <u>exam</u>

LETRS completion certificates must be verified by <u>LouisianaLiteracy@la.gov</u> for add-on credit.

Add-on Literacy Requirements (Grades K-3, **Special Education**)

For add-on in areas authorized to teach grades K-3 and special education areas, educators must meet:

General literacy contact or semester hour equivalent requirements

AND*

Teaching of Reading exam requirements



^{*} Requirements cannot be fulfilled with two exams.

Mentor/Content Leader



Mentor and Resident Funding

All certificates required (Practitioner License, Resident license, Mentor credential or waiver) must be issued by **October 1** in order to be eligible for funding.

The resident must hold a resident certificate with a valid from date on or before **October 1**.



Mentor and Resident Funding Eligibility

- The resident must serve in a MFP funded entity.
- The resident must serve with a mentor teacher in the same MFP funded entity as the resident teacher.
- The resident must serve with a mentor teacher that is reported in ED Link 360 Staffing with an object code of 112 (teacher) and a function code within the 1000s excluding 1530 (Pre-K) and 1531 (Head Start).
- The resident must serve with a mentor teacher holding one of the following on October 1, 2024: Mentor Teacher Certificate, Provisional Mentor Teacher Ancillary Certificate, or Mentor Waiver Credential.

Mentor Waiver

- Waivers were requested and granted for the 2020-2021, 2021-2022, 2022-2023, and 2023-2024 school years.
- As of March 2024, there are approximately 3,246 credentialed mentors statewide; the need for 2023-2024 was 1,374 mentors.
- Policy changes proposed for April BESE include:
 - LDOE to approve waivers on an individual basis; and
 - Individuals mutually agreed upon for up to 2 years.

The 2024-2025 Mentor Waiver Application Portal will open on August 1.

During Learning Visits, participants have an opportunity to observe Grow Your Own work that is being done in another school system and strategize to improve Grow Your Own efforts in their system. The visits are for System Leads, Teacher Leaders, and Postsecondary Teacher Preparation Partners.

Updated Legislation

Act 266 of 2023 requires teachers to screen all kindergarten students for dyslexia during the second half of the year or upon request of a parent/guardian or teacher.

Act 260 of 2023 requires all grade 4-8 public school teachers of mathematics to receive numeracy skills training focused on instructing students according to the vertical alignment of math concepts and the blending of concepts, procedures, strategies, problem-solving, and disposition. Initial guidance is now available.

Courses specific for our preparation providers are live.



Math Competencies

Act 347 of the 2023 Regular Session, states that BESE shall revise teacher certification requirements and the requirements of teacher education programs to require instruction on foundational numeracy skills standards for candidates seeking certification to teach students no later than December 31, 2023.

<u>Bulletin 746 §507.B.12</u> Beginning **September 1, 2028**, an applicant for initial certification must have earned coursework or equivalent contact hours in alignment with the adopted foundational numeracy competencies.
